# Campbell says letter, death threat related

The letter suggests vandalising Toronto Sun paper boxes by such methods as pouring quick-drying glue into the coin mechanisms. It also recommends spray painting Catholic church literature in pink, or stealing it, since it is seen as often critical of homosexuality.

Included in the QUALADA text is a list of phone numbers, with Reverend Campbell's at the top. Next to his name, in brackets, is a notation reading "we all know this monster." The letter recommends readers "call our enemies and tell them off," preferably "late at night and as often as possible."

It's puzzling there has no been more of a backlash against the letter writers, he said Thursday. "I'm astonished there is t as much of an outcry from the (political) left as when the KKK (Ku Klux Klan) came to Georgetown." Ku Klux Klan supporters staged a small march through downtown Georgetown last weekend. Mr. Campbell billed the QUALADA letter "as vicious as KKK literature."

Mr. Campbell said he hopes more rational homosexual rights advocates will step forward and denounce the QUALADA text. "It would be most helpful if those who represent a responsible voice for the homosexual community would disavow this."

While he believes homosexuality contravenes Biblical teachings, Mr. Campbell said he has never advocated harassing adults who choose same-sex relationships in the privacy of their homes. "Our position is that the law should be blind on consensual adult sex."

As far as the death threat goes, "there's no question we have to take that threat seriously. On the other hand, I don't lose a bit of sleep over it."

# Duignan supports horse industry's fight against casinos

The province's horse racing industry has joined in the Ontario Federation of Agriculture's fight against the establishment of casinos.

"The effects of casinos on horse racing will be dramatic and devastating," said Dr. Glen Brown, chairman of the Ontario Agriculture and Horse Racing Coalition (OAHRC).

"Any projected economic gain to the government in recessionary times will be at a terrible cost in jobs and real investments in rural Ontario."

The OAHRC represents breeding farms, race tracks, agricultural interests, and thoroughbred and harness horse organizations.

Members of the racing industry and horse farming plan to blitz MPPs during the next few weeks to show their disapproval of the government's initiatives to open gambling casinos in Ontario.

"This is not just a horse racing issue," added Ontario Federation of Agriculture President Roger George. 'This is an issue for rural Ontario.

"The Premier (Bob Rae) doesn't seem to understand that the establishment of casinos and other gaming outlets has the potential to put at risk a large portion of the 50,000 equine-related jobs and take much-needed

money from Ontario farmers' pockets.

"The equine industry annually purchases \$350 million in grain, feed and straw from its farm neighbours."

Halton North MPP Noel Duignan said he's opposed to

casinos because of the potential "impact" they have on horse racing, a major industry in his riding.

While he said a casino in Windsor (where Ontario's first ! is planned) would likely not affect the industry in the Milton area, such a facility in Toronto would have an impact.

In American cities, casino Noel Dulgnan development caused racing interest to drop by 25 per cent, according to Mr. Duignan.

Rural Ontario has strong voting strength, Mr. George warned Premier Rae.

"What this government has failed to recognize is that it has 27 rural seats. Mr. Rae needs to be reminded that there is a voting constituency outside the boundaries of Metropolitan Toronto," he added.

"This is just one more sign of his blatant disregard for the economic survival of those who live in Ontario's concession roads."
