



PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE. BELL SCHOOL LINE RECONSTRUCTION FROM STEELES AVENUE TO 200 METRES SOUTH OF 14TH SIDEROAD

The Town of Milton is planning to reconstruct Bell School Line from Steeles Avenue to 200 metres south of 14th Sideroad and 14th Sideroad from 200 metres west to 100 metres east of Bell School Line. The works include a new two-lane pavement surface with an improved road profile. At the intersection of Bell School and 14th Sideroad, alternative road alignments have been prepared including either maintaining existing road location or the removal of the Bell School Line jog.

A Public Information Centre will be held at the time and place indicated below. Background information has been assembled and preliminary plans have been prepared. These plans may be seen at the Information Centre where the Town's staff and consultant will be on hand to explain the proposed works, answer questions and receive comments.


