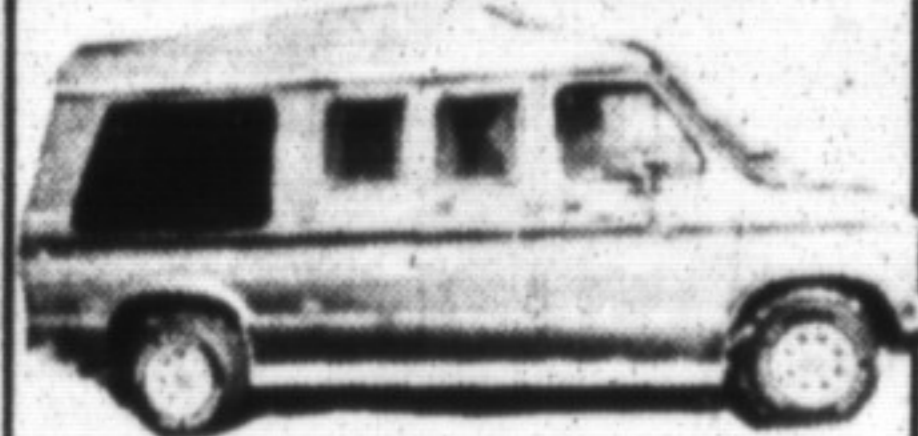

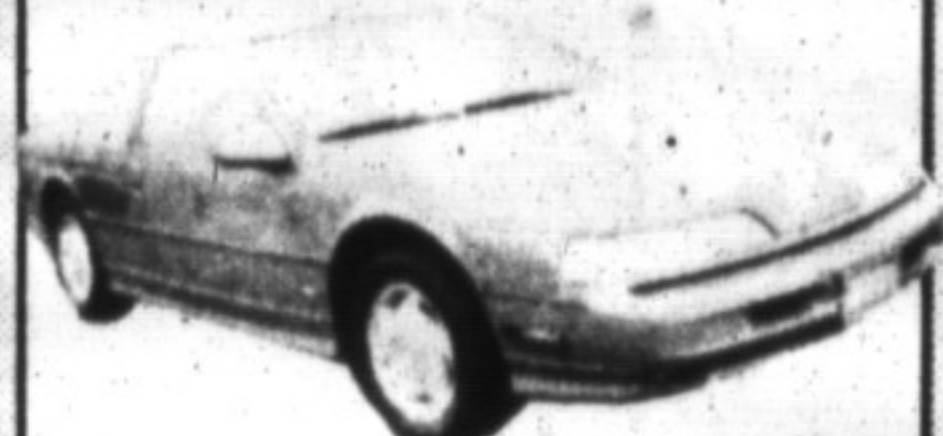

**Safety of women drivers
goal of street-proofing film**

Camera crews were in Milton this week shooting scenes for an upcoming film which warns women about the dangers of travelling alone.

The Luft Films production called *Travelling Alone* will be part of an OPP program advising women about safety precautions while on the road.

The company shot segments of the film at the Fifth Wheel Truck Stop Monday and wrapped up in Milton on No. 10 Sideroad, east of Highway 25, Wednesday.

Daytime shooting Wednesday included a scene where a woman's body was being removed from a wooded area. The Milton OPP and two men from a local funeral home appeared on camera.

Brad Luft, producer-director for Luft Films, approached the OPP a year ago with the idea to shoot the film. Working with a \$100,000 budget, the Toronto company has also found sponsors.

Ford Canada, Royal Insurance and the Canadian Automobile Association are the major co-sponsors among a long list.

At the No. 10 Sideroad filming location Wednesday, associate producer Joan Mizzi Paley said Mr.

Luft decided to make the film out of concern for his wife and other women who are on the road by themselves.

Ms Mizzi Paley said *Travelling Alone* emphasizes "three scenarios" based on real-life incidents where women were victimized.

The dramatizations focus on the murder three years ago of a student who was stranded on Highway 401 with a flat tire.

Another scenario involves a flight attendant who was driving home along Airport Road late a night. Her car was hit by a vehicle and then she was attacked by the driver. The third dramatization centres on a woman travelling to another city.

Scenes have been shot across Ontario, and the company also plans to bring cameras to Florida in April. The film should be completed by June, said Ms Paley.



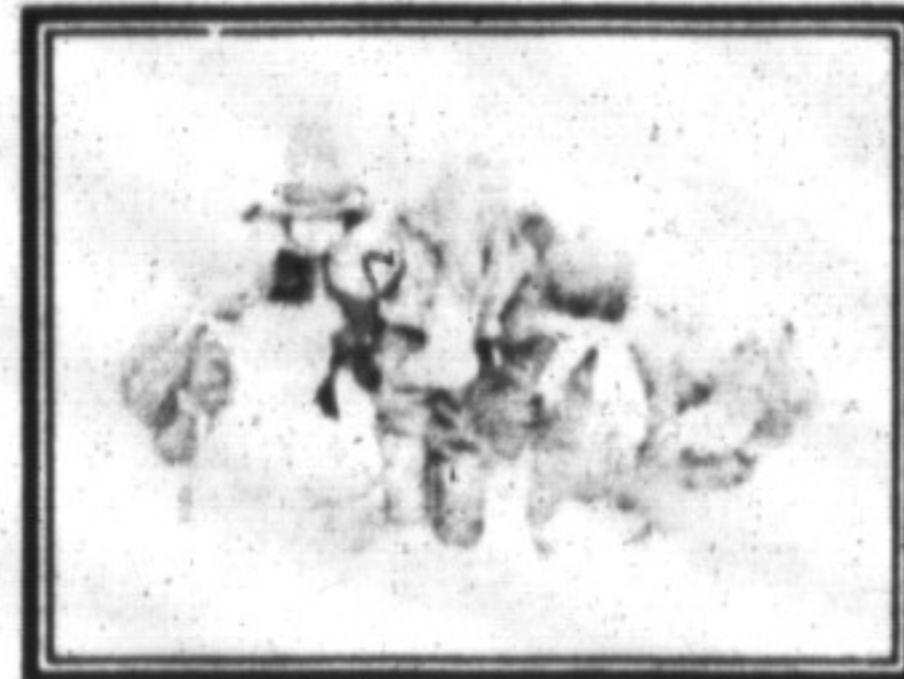
