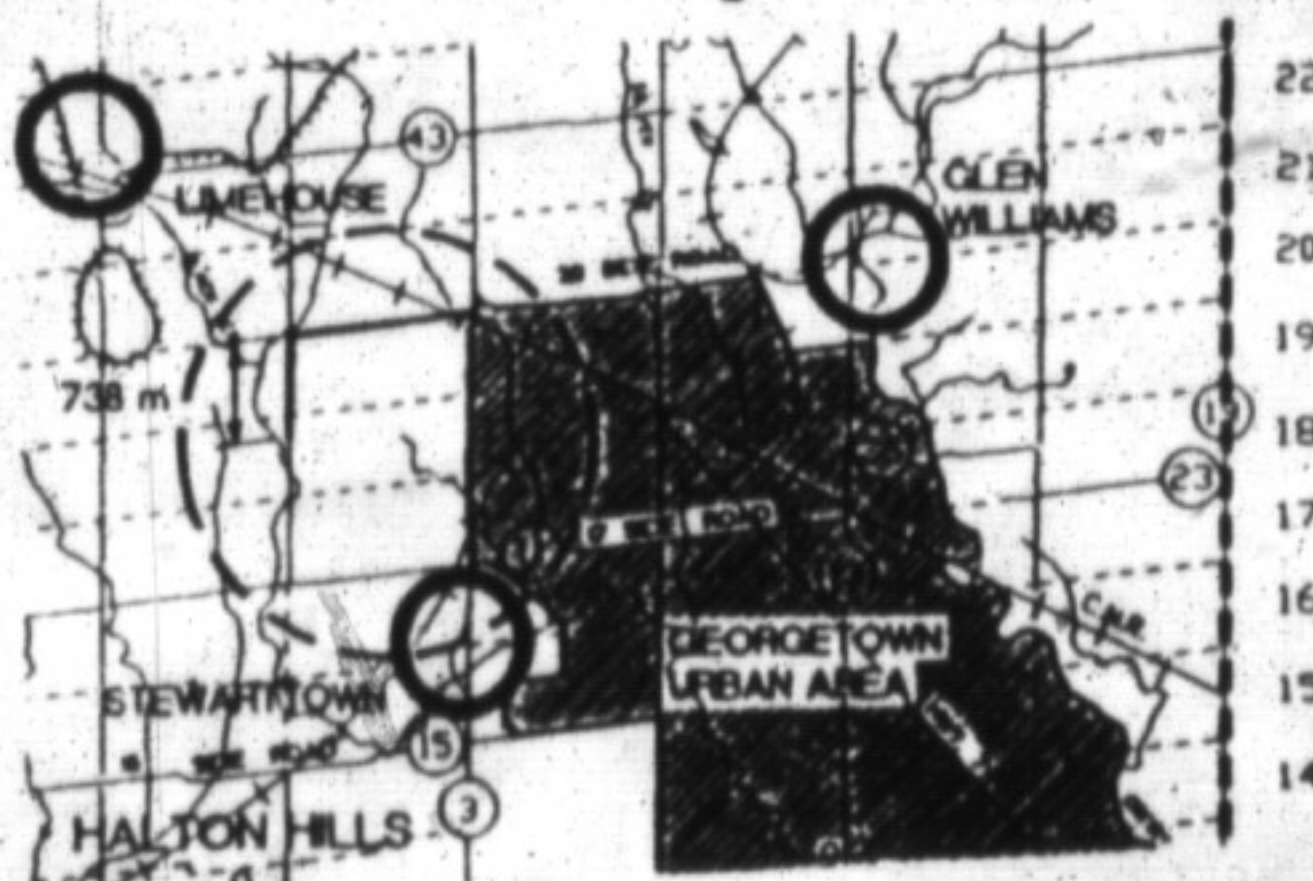
NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING PROPOSED OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 19 TO THE OFFICIAL PLAN FOR HALTON

The Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton, through its Planning and Public Works Committee, will hold a public meeting to provide interested individuals and agencies the opportunity to express their views and provide comments on proposed Halton Official Plan Amendment No. 19. The public meeting will be held on:

1151 Bronte Road, Oakville

The purpose of Halton Official Plan Amendment No. 19 is to amend the Sanitary Sewage Disposal and Water Supply policies of the Regional Plan to permit the extension of a municipal watermain from the Georgetown Urban Area, west along No. 20 Side Road and approximately 738 metres south along the Sixth Line in order to provide water to residential properties fronting on the watermain.

Forum to address changes in rural living expectations

'Our rural areas face the challenge of the transition from largely agriculture to a community with mixed expectations,' says organizer

Rural doesn't just mean farmland anymore and the changes affecting those who live in these evolving areas will be the topic of a panel discussion Sunday.

Ebenezer United Church will be the location of the public forum called "Changing Rural Communities".

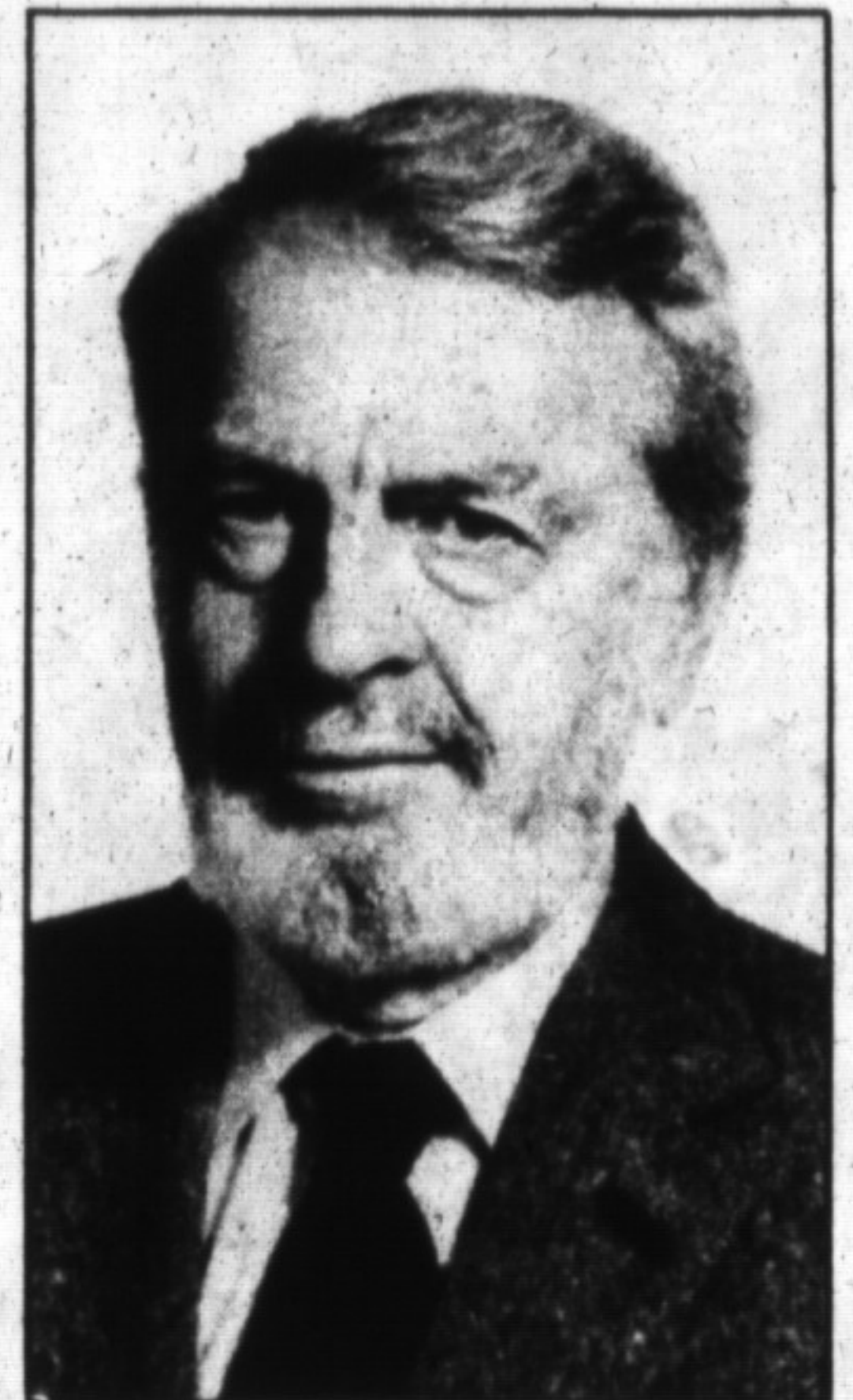
"It is an evening of great importance as our rural areas face the challenge of the transition from largely agriculture to a community with mixed expectations," said Barb Parker, chair of the organizing committee.

Speakers will include Alex Sim, Bev Slater and Carl Sulliman, with local farmer John Kitching as moderator. Each will make a short presentation, and participate in a discussion. The audience will also be invited to participate with questions and comments.

Alex Sim is widely read as the author of *Land and Community - Crisis in Canada's Countryside* and *Plight of the Rural Church*. He also is past president of the Rural Learning Association and was a farmer until 1979.

Dairy farmer Bev Slater has been involved in rural issues for 26 years. Her world-wide experience includes work with the United Church in Zambia, chair of the London Conference Division of World Outreach and service on the board of directors of Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

Carl H. Sulliman, is the CEO of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, the Ontario Agricultural Train-

ing Institute and the Agriculture Publishing Company. His experience in government and the rural community gives him a broad perspective on the needs of Ontario's agricultural community.

The evening is organized by the outreach committee of Ebenezer pastoral charge which includes Arkel, Eden Mills and Ebenezer, United Churches. Refreshments will follow the presentation which begins at 7:30 p.m.

There is no admission but donations will be accepted. The church is located on Guelph Line, 6km north of Hwy. 401.

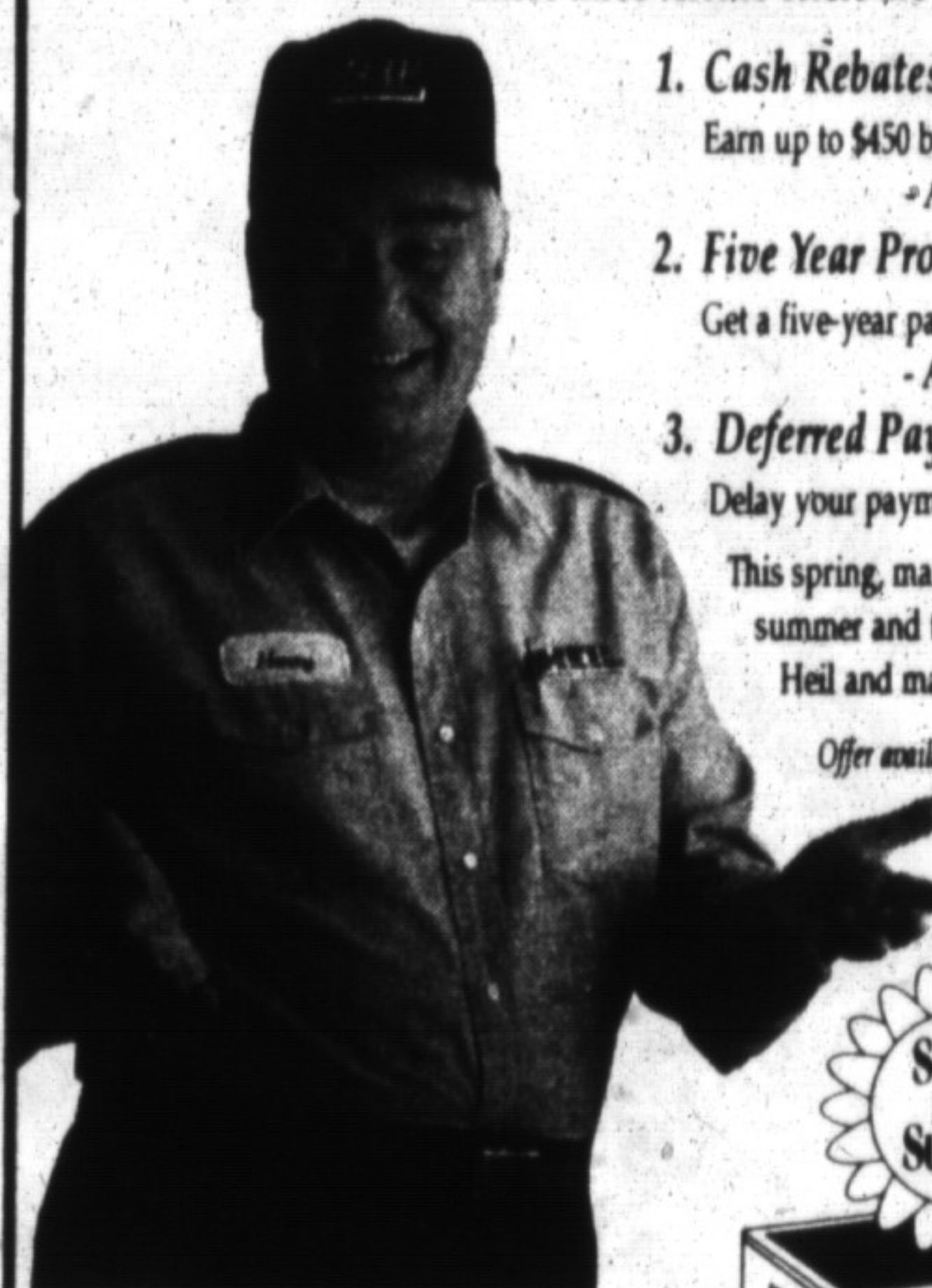
