

'Enviro House' finds home in Halton schools The Halton Board of Education re-

cently honoured an organization for its role in an environmental program which will teach children how to build and insulate a wall, fix a leaky faucet, and reduce household garbage.

The Junior League of Hamilton-Burlington raised \$300,000 to fund new teaching resource Enviro-House, a portable scale model of an environmentally sound home which focuses on the kitchen and bathroom areas.

Bea McDonough and Eva Riis-Culver, co-chairpersons of Junior League's environment committee, were presented certificates of appreciation at a Halton Board of Education meeting earlier this month.

"It's not often someone gives students a \$300,000 gift, so we really wanted to make sure that Junior League was recognized," said Dave Coons, chairman of the Board.

Halton and Hamilton-Wentworth elementary school students in grades four to six will benefit from Enviro-House, which has been more than two years in the planning.

Junior League raised the \$300,000 price tag through corporate donations from private and business sectors.


A representative from each of the five school boards in the two regions worked collaboratively with the Junior League in the design of Enviro-House.

Ron Ballentine, the Board's environment project consultant served on the Enviro-House Steering Committee, while Sheila Segato, a teacher at Maplehurst Public School in Burlington, was one of five people who developed the manual that will help teachers integrate the resource into existing curriculum.

"This will be an invaluable tool in teaching children and their families environmental awareness," said Mr. Ballentine.

Along with "the house," each school will be given a teacher manual and provided with a half-day inservice at no expense to the board.
