

CRIME STOPPERS OF HALTON

55-year-old suspect wanted

Rash of apartment break-ins

Halton Regional Police detectives in Burlington and Crime Stoppers are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the person(s) responsible for a series of apartment break-ins.

Between April 8 and 13, unknown person(s) gained entry to three apartments at 1305 Ontario St., 1285 Ontario St., and 1275 Elgin Street in Burlington.

Investigators believe the suspects used a pry bar to force the apartment doors and it would appear the same suspects were responsible for all three entries.

Stolen from these apartments were various amounts of Canadian and United States currency, jewellery, foodstuffs, liquor, beer, VCRs, compact discs and clothing.

During one of the entries April 10 at 7:30 p.m., the apartment owner arrived home to find his door damaged. He entered and discovered a suspect described as male, white, 5'6", with grey/white hair,

approximately 55 years of age, average to slim build, and approximately two days growth of beard stubble.

He was wearing a blue, three-quarter-length trench coat, dark work pants and possible work boots. The suspect ran out of the apartment leaving a plastic bag of items behind.

Identifiable property includes: Toshiba VCR model M221, serial 81541273; four Norman Rockwell plates — series Gourmet, serial 6554G; The Storyteller, 19717; the Painter, 7501A, and the Music Maker, 12128B; a Gold 24k pocket watch inscribed with WDG; and a passport.

If you have any information that leads to an arrest in this or any other case, you may be eligible for a cash reward of up to \$1,000. You need not give your name and your information will be treated with complete anonymity.

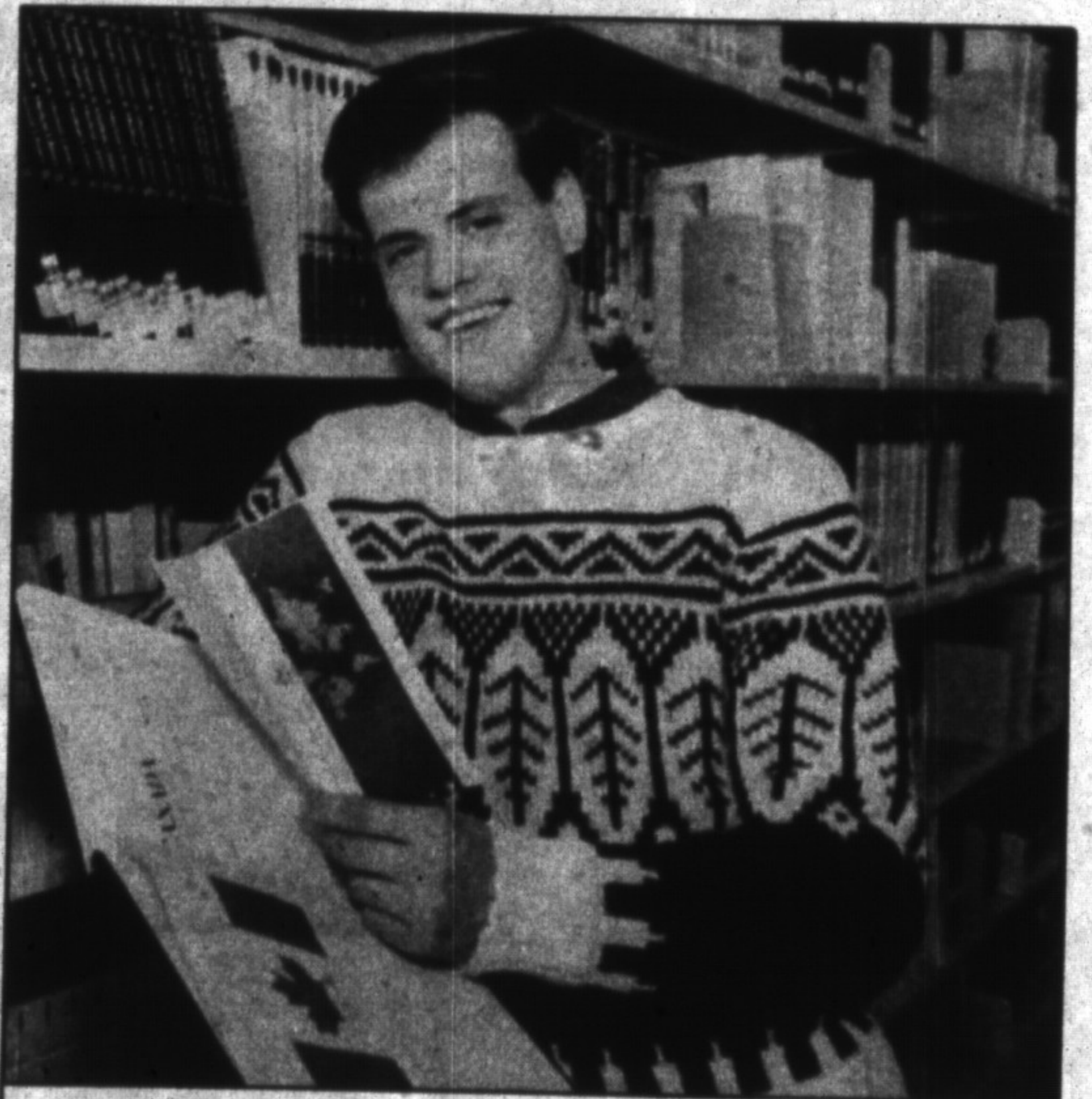

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

**IN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS
THE ONTARIO WEED CONTROL ACT AS IT
APPLIES TO PERSONS IN POSSESSION OF LAND
WITHIN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS**

Unless noxious weeds are destroyed by May 27th, 1993, and as often as necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owner and collected in the manner of municipal taxes.

The Weed Control Act creates an offence for persons who contravene the Act or the regulations. The Town may proceed with legal action against any owner or person who fails to comply with the Act.

Goatshead, thistles, poison ivy, ragweed, wild carrot and milkweed are among the weeds considered noxious, and must be destroyed wherever found. Complaints regarding dandelion and golden rod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious under the terms of The Weed Control Act.

Anonymous complaints will not be accepted.
