of Jim McKellar, a Halton Hills businessman, who previously worked for several years in the medical field.

The former paramedic, who opened the Georgetown-based Re-Med Foundation in February, makes 'old wheelchairs, walkers and other equipment work like new.

The company acquires health care aids - from lifts and beds to washroom equipment and scooters - through donations by people who are no longer using them.

"We recondition this equipment and offer it to people who are in need a modest sum, enough to cover our expenses." Costs to his clients end up about 75 per cent less than the original retail value, according to Mr. McKellar.

He says his years in the medical profession - as an ambulance attendant in the Metro Toronto Ambulance Ser-

vice and later in home health care equipment sales — opened his eyes to the financial demands involved in purchasing such aids.

"I realized there was a void where government funding stopped. Patients not qualifying or in need of extra equipment often found costs prohibitive."

An electric wheelchair can cost as much as \$16,000, but the maximum government grant doesn't come close to that number, he said.
