Fiddlers Fun controlled the mile every step of the way for driver Steve Condren, setting fractions of :27.3, :56.2 and 1:24.3 enroute to his sparkling victory.

"He felt so good, I wasn't going to let anyone go," explained Condren, "we weren't going for a track record; we just had a prompter." (referring to Ritchies Imperial).

Chapter and Verse won the first Mohawk division for trainer Bill Robinson and driver Bill Gale in a lifetime best 1:53.4.

Crisis Situation took the third Mohawk division in a life's best 1:53.3 for driver Doug Brown and trainer Joe Stutzman.

The second leg of the Mohawk Series goes postward May 15 and the final will swing in behind the starting gate Sunday, May 23.

Along with the Mohawk Pacing Series, North America Cup eligibles will prep in The New Jersey Pacing Classic (The Meadowlands, May 29) and the Burlington (Greenwood, June 12). Final sustaining payments for the North America Cup are due May 15.

Staying Together scored a 1:51.1 victory in the \$175,500 final of The Graduate Pacing Series at The Meadowlands Saturday night.






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


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
