

of those charged by the school boards for marks achieved by students," explained Regional Chairman Floyd Fauntleroy.

The Region is fighting with the provincial government, saying the collection of the 20 per cent GST and 25 per cent PST on the performance taxes places an unnecessary burden on regional staff.

A joint mortgage burning was held today at Greystone Country Club (owned by CUPE), marking the final payments of SkyDome and Maple Leaf Gardens by the federation of Teachers Union Corporation and OMERS (Ontario Municipal Employees Retirement Savings), who together purchased these facilities as part of the social contract clause negotiated by Bob Rae in 1993. "We are planning to pension off Floyd," said chief school custodian and OMERS Director Kuldip Singh, in a phone interview from his yacht in Aruba. ## Handle pressure-treated wood with care


Because we want our fences, decks, play structures and flower beds to last longer than the Titanic, we often consider buying pressure-treated wood. Although we think we are building "Play-land" for our children we may be building "Arsenic land" instead.

Wood is commonly treated with chromated copper arsenate (CCA) to extend its life against fungi, insects and micro-organisms. The result is the greenish wood with slits on the surface available at lumber yards and building supply stores.

A 1991 study for Health and Welfare Canada found that the soil under CCA treated tions up to 24 times higher than areas 10 meters away. They also used cloth to wipe these structures and got measurable amounts of arsenic on the cloth every time.

Arsenic is widespread in the environment and we are all exposed to a low level. However, the U.S. EPA's fact sheet on CCA warns: "Arsenicals are acutely toxic to humans by inbeen classified as human carcinogens based on sufficient human epidemiological evidence. the process wouldn't be effective. But treated registration of wood preservatives containing under its intended conditions of use." arsenic and chromium are lacking."

CCA is registered for use in Canada, as the Canadian Institute of Treated Wood (CITW) points out.

CITW maintains that "seasoning after pressure treating leaves the wood clean", ignoring the results of the wipe tests. CITW also states gestion . . . Both arsenic and chromium have in their literature, "If the chemicals used for the pressure treatment of wood weren't toxic, Environmental fate data to support the wood is not toxic to humans and animals

It is recommended to wear gloves, goggles Health and Welfare Canada agrees. To avoid problems we can: use substitutes on sex tax inspector first class Peeping Tom. such as cedar, cypress, locust, stone, brick, concrete or materials made from recycled plastic; seal all presure-treated wood surfaces with paint or marine varnish to prevent leaching and skin exposure.

To extend the wood's life, use commercial non-toxic wood preservatives such as Donnos, made from purely organic raw materials. have used this and found it works very well.

Or, make non-toxic wood preservative. have a recipe developed by the USDA Forest Products Laboratory which I will gladly share if you want to send a SASE to me c/o The Champion.
