Auxiliary gives largest donation yet to hospital

Fashion shows, bingos and gift shop sales helped add up to the \$60,000 the Milton District Hospital Auxiliary will hand over to the hospital board this year.

The largest total to date, was announced Thursday evening at the auxiliary's annual meeting at Milton Curling Club.

The event serves to recognize the volunteers who help raise the funds and provide special services at the local health care centre. Beth Snow, a Grade 10 student at Bishop Reding was presented with the Isobel Patterson award as outstanding junior volunteer.

She has donated 198 hours since joining the hospital program in 1990 and has attracted others to become volunteers. It was her "hard work and caring attitude" that earned the honour, according to outgoing junior volunteer

coordinator Claudia Jaecklien.

Ms Snow spends her volunteer hours with chronic care, medical and surgical patients. She hopes for a career in medicine, specializing in sports injuries.

Also aspiring to a career in medicine is the recipient of the Outstanding First Year Junior Volunteer Award, Lindsay Bruce. The Grade 10 student at Milton District High School spends much of her time in the chronic care ward, feeding and visiting patients.

Senior volunteer Donna McMullen was the recipient of another surprise award. Her commitment to the auxiliary's new bingo fund-raisers, the gift shop, monthly chronic care tea and participation in special events was cited during the presentation.

"She's the quiet type who gets things done," said volunteer coordinator Shelagh Conway.

Joy Clarke is already a life member of the local auxiliary but Thursday she was given the highest honour of Provincial Life Member. She'll pick up her award at the annual Hospital Auxiliaries of Ontario Convention on November 9.

Three new life members were announced at the meeting. The honour, and pleasant surprise went to Bernice Mayes, publicity convenor and gift shop worker; Joyce Batt, board member, ways and means director and gift shop worker; and Beatrice Cross, buyer for the hospital gift shop and active fund-raiser.

The new slate of officers was elected, making Dicky Deumer president and Carol Wilson past-president. Joan Griffith was named first vice-president.

Each year the auxiliary salutes members of the community who assist in their work. The recipients were: Marie Hamden and Judy Grimly for donating a new nativity scene to the hospital following the theft of the original; John Tarnawsky, of the hospital maintenance staff for his good nature and patience in assisting members; Ron Shannon, cook at the annual Strawberry Social and star ticket salesman; and Doug Heggie for donating and cooking hotdogs at the social.

The auxiliary called on its own members to provide entertainment.
