President knocks closed nomination

from REFORM on page 1 on events and welcomed Mr. Andrus "when I realized how adamant the (local) board was" to have him orchestrate the campaign.

But "Calgary told us they would cut us off if (Mr.) Andrus was on board," Dr. Somersall said. "I had to choose — to have Calgary do absolutely nothing, to run a campaign without any Reform input, or to tell David to get lost and go back to Calgary with my tail between my legs."

At that point, "I said to myself, 'this has gone from bad to worse,'" Dr. Somersall recounted. He decided to quit.

Events "had a very demoralizing effect on the board," in Oakville-Milton, the former candidate said.

But he appears to have few reser-

vations about the decision he made, despite the fact a federal election looms. "I'm not sticking things out, doing something for its own sake. That's garbage. Everything I do, I do with conviction. When I lose that sense of conviction, I can no longer convince others."

"When a riding loses its first choice as candidate, it has a problem," Dr. Somersall acknowledged. "Who knows what's going to happen?"

Dr. Somersall said there are "other cans of worms" that concern him and influenced his decisions, but he declined to be specific.

"I don't really want to perpetuate the discussion. I have no axe to grind."

Ms Butcher said the riding execu-

tive, including Dr. Somersall, had been "absolutely delighted" to have Mr. Andrus initially as a potential campaign manager.

But, Ms Butcher wrote in her letter to Reform's approximately 700 riding members, Mr. Andrus was subsequently expelled from the party in late May, "for matters unrelated to either (Dr. Somersall) or this constituency."

Mr. Andrus was not available for comment at press time.

Ms Butcher said riding members "are not very happy" with events. "My phone has been ringing off the hook with expressions of outrage."

The whole train of events "is very much a disappointment to me," she added. "I'm still trying to get over it."
