

Cops, MNR, will patrol deer hunt Nov. 1-5

Conservation officers will team up with their counterparts in the police to make sure a five-day controlled deer hunt in Halton goes smoothly.

"We will have our officers in the the field and police will have a car in the field," said John Bennett of the Ministry of Natural Resource's Maple District, which includes all of Halton.

Shotgun hunting will be permitted Nov. 1-5 for those whose names have been drawn to participate in the controlled hunt. Some farmers and landowners will also qualify, Mr. Bennett said. In all, 575 tags will be issued.

"We want a hunter who has a licence, has the appropriate tag, has permission from the landowner and is in an area where hunting is permitted." Mr. Bennett said.

Mr. Bennett said hunters must follow municipal discharge bylaws, which vary from municipality to municipality within Halton.

"We ask that they refer to the local municipality to find out what the restrictions are," he said.

Mr. Bennett said the MNR will be coordinating the hunt closely with police regional municipalities so that safety and trespassing complaints are dealt with swiftly.


"If someone sees an individual on their property they don't want there they should call us immediately," he

The MNR's statistics show hunting-related complaints in Halton have dropped dramatically since 1986, when 20 were received. Only a handful of have come to the MNR in the last five years.

The MNR, regional and provincial police and municipal representatives have formed a working group to deal with issues of enforcement and coordination of the hunt. The group has met once and will meet again following the hunt.


