

King Street man faces impaired charges

A 23-year-old King Street man faces impaired driving-related charges.

A Halton Regional Police officer on patrol pulled over a car at Ontario Street and Woodward Avenue after noticing the vehicle swerve between lanes, stop at a green light and make a wide turn shortly before 3:30 a.m. Saturday.

A man was subsequently charged with impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood. He was held for a bail hearing.

Indecent exposure

Two young girls, one aged 12, have reported to police that a jogger exposed himself to them while they were walking on Laurier Avenue October 10.

The girls were walking near 16 Mile Creek at about 3 p.m. when the man approached them; they told police.

The suspect is described as between the ages of 25 and 30 years, 5'8", 160 pounds, with dirty blond, slightly curly hair. He was wearing gray sweat pants and a pink sweat shirt.

Assault charges

A 41-year-old Main Street man was charged with two counts of assault after two people were punched in the head Thursday evening.

The suspect's common-law wife, 31, and a 70-year-old male friend of the family from Oakville were hit by a man while sitting in a car outside the woman's home.

The woman and the senior citizen were on their way out for coffee shortly after 7 p.m., police said.
