Flu shot needed for some people

Older people and other individuals with various medical conditions should have a flu shot to get them safely through the fall and winter months, says the Ontario Medical Association (OMA).

Those who fall into the high-risk categories are seniors — people 65 or older — individuals suffering heart conditions, chronic-lung conditions such as emphysema, asthma or bronchitis, diseases such as diabetes, cancer, anemia, renal or sickle-cell immunodeficiency/supdisease. presion and children on long-term ASA treatment.

In Ontario, more than 7,000 people are admitted to hospital each year as a result of complications from getting the flu, the OMA said. Pneumonia is the most common complication of influenza. Others include kidney failure and a variety of nervous system disorders. Seniors comprise 50 per cent of those admitted annually and 85 per cent of the more than 300 deaths a year in the province attributed to influenza.
