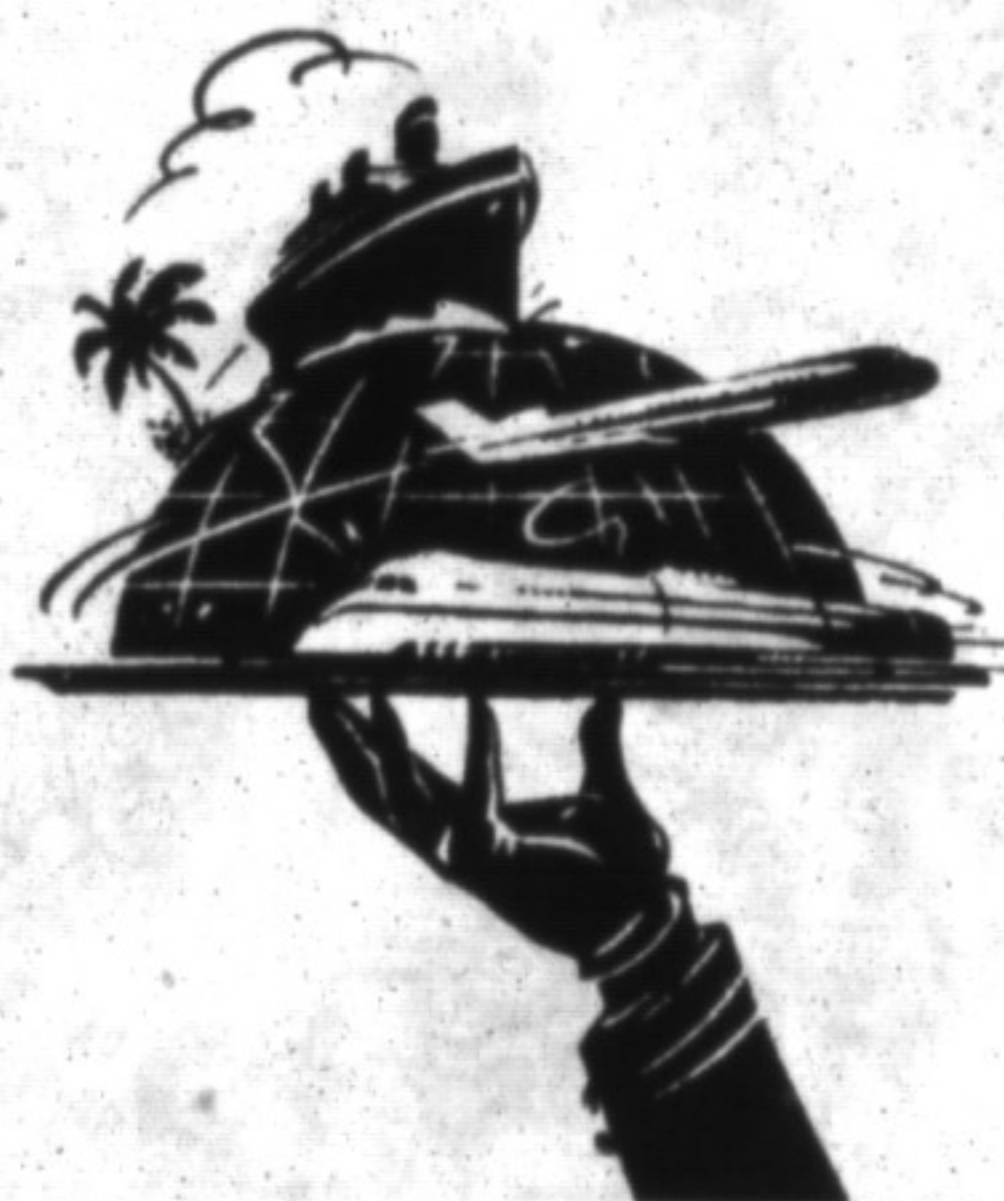
Be it resolved that the week of November 7 - 13, 1993 be declared **UNITY IN DIVERSITY WEEK** in the Town of Milton.

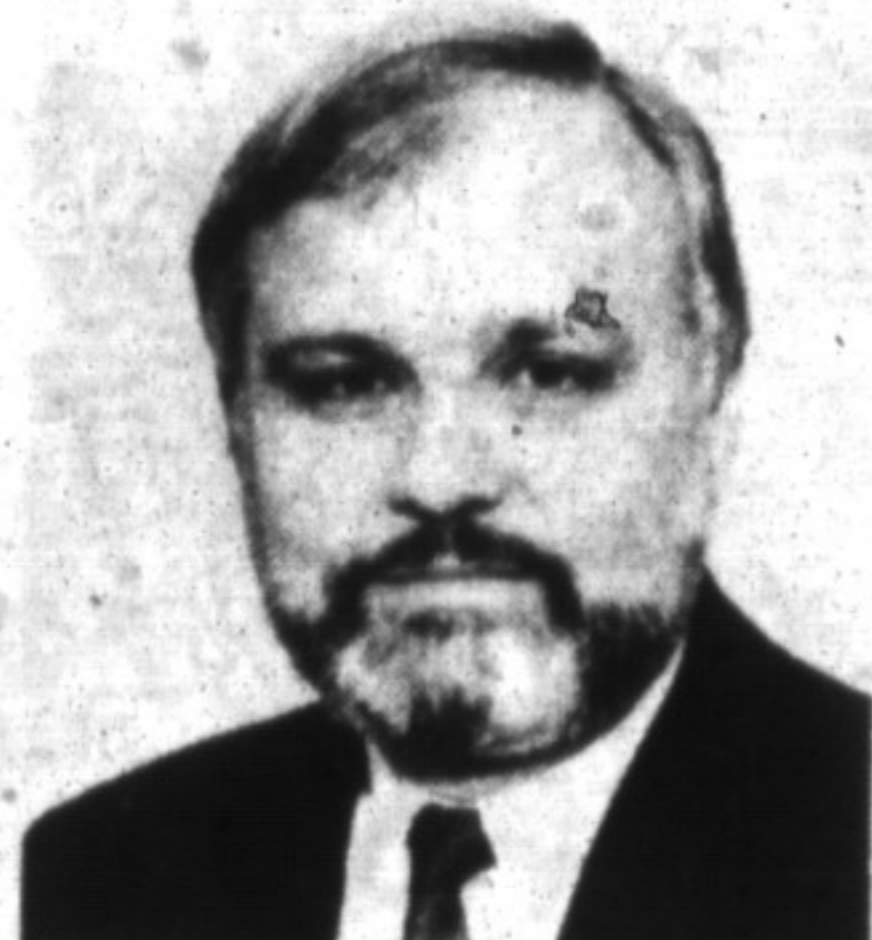

Angry woman on Commercial Street says her Devil's Night wasn't quiet

Halton Regional Police reported a quiet Devil's Night in town, but to residents of a Commercial Street townhouse complex, it wasn't.

According to a resident of 551 Commercial St., vandals caused thousands of dollars worth of

damage to at least 100 cars in the complex.

"Every second car was damaged," Lori Savard, 26, told *The Champion* Wednesday.

A tire of Ms Savard's car was slashed, and she had to pay \$160 to replace it.

Numerous other vehicles were vandalized in similar fashion, she noted.

"We expected eggs," she said.

The already angry woman became more upset when a story in *The Champion* about Devil's Night incidents failed to mention the Commercial Street vandalism.

Instead Ms Savard read in Wednesday's paper that, according

to police, this year's eve of Halloween was overall more quiet than usual with only "some willful damages."

"It was down a lot because of the poor weather conditions," detective sergeant Mike Kingston said yesterday.

Last year, vandals caused at least \$15,000 damage to property on Devil's Night throughout town. Police blamed "roving gangs of youths" for most of the incidents, which included an overturned pick-up truck.

Ms Savard added that several cars in the Commercial Street complex were targeted by vandals one night earlier this fall as well.
