Halton reviewing lobby group membership

Halton Region will sit back and gather the facts, play a little politics and then decide.

Last week the regional administration and finance committee recommended that Halton gather information on a growing split in the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) and proceed with attempts at reconciliation before reviewing its membership.

The City of Ottawa wants to tear the system down and has asked Halton, among other municipalities, to join them in breaking away from AMO and forming a splinter organization to further the interests of large population centres in Ontario.

AMO has a task force to deal with

concerns and disenchantment from the large urban groups regarding "fair and equitable representation." Halton chairman Peter Pomeroy and Halton chief administrative officer John Burke both sit on the committee.

Mr. Pomeroy urged reconciliation, suggesting that part of the problem was simply the logistics of getting all the interested parties together to discuss their problems.

"A couple of people out there are unhappy with the role that AMO is playing," Mr. Pomeroy said. "I'm one of them."

However, "while AMO can afford to lose the membership of some small municipalities, it can't lose a bunch of Ottawas before the organization collapses," he added. "I firmly believe we should stick with AMO and restructure. It needs to be better and either we get that resolved or we're out. We don't want to waste time and money."

"Municipalities are not islands unto themselves," said Oakville councillor Liz Behrens. "We need to take part in organizations like AMO."

know about its technical aspects. The goal isn't winning races, it's teaching them to be responsible people."

Mr. Poletto said he wanted a project that would stimulate students as well as fulfil educational requirements.

He said the students learned about a host of subjects while constructing the car, including math, science and media.

Racing the car teaches the students about the importance of preparation in being successful.

"They have to be responsible when we're at the racetrack. They have to earn the respect of the other drivers. It also teaches them that the place to go racing is a drag strip, not public roads."

"It's a good way to keep students out of mischief," said Joe Leone, 18; one of eight students who helped construct the car.

Mr. Leone, a member of the student pit crew, said he looks forward to spending time at the racetrack because "it lets me work with my hands and I enjoy watching the cars."

"I enjoy being at school because of the car," he added.

Mr. Poletto said the ultimate goal is to have students driving the car as well as himself.

Mr. Poletto said he'd also like to organize a racing circuit with other area schools, but that too would involve board of education approval.

"The whole idea is to get the students to drive. Nobody wants to put that much work in and get nothing out of it."
