This includes the fight against all lung disease ranging from lung cancer, emphysema and asthma to the growing concern over resur-



In October, Ms Porter said letters were sent out to past contributors asking for donations. A "householder" - a package of educational information and some seals was sent to every home in Halton. "The money is slow in coming in but we hope by the end of January we'll be well on our way," said Ms Porter.




