

Charge dismissed against silent, praying protester

A woman known for her praying on Martin Street appeared in Milton provincial court yesterday in connection with disturbances at Catholic churches in Milton and Halton Hills.

Lucia Amodeo, 49, of Georgetown prayed in the back of the courtroom for several hours yesterday while waiting for her case to be heard. When finally called before the court, Ms Amodeo knelt where the accused usually stands and continued praying.

She refused to respond when asked if she was guilty or not guilty of an alleged Nov. 12 disturbance at Holy Cross Church in Georgetown, and was presumed by Judge William Sharpe to be pleading not guilty.

Following testimeny, the charge accusing her of interrupting a charismatic prayer group at the church was store across from the plaza. dismissed by Judge Sharpe, due to

lack of evidence.

Ms Amodeo, who believes charismatic-type worship is the work of Satan, still faces five charges in connection with other alleged disturbances at Holy Cross, as well as Holy

Rosary Church on Martin Street.

Because the remaining charges are similar, they were put over until Jan. 6 to be heard by a different judge, at the request of Crown Attorney James Cornish.

Mr. Cornish says he intends to withdraw further charges of sexual assault and making obscene material at Mr. Cassidy's sentencing


