No impaired charges on RIDE spotchecks . . . yet

More than 3,000 people have so far been stopped in RIDE spot checks on Milton highways, but no impaired driving charges have been laid, according to police.

However, the Milton OPP reports seven 12-hour licence suspensions have been issued to local motorists since the campaign to deter drinking and driving started December 1.

As of December 16, police hadn't caught any impaired drivers among 3,421 vehicles stopped.

The Milton OPP will continue to set up Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere (RIDE) spot checks on highways 25 and 401 until January 1.

Know Your Dealer!

In the world of sports collectibles, an autographed ball or bat or tee-shirt can be worth a lot of money. And when that autograph belongs to a batting ace and member of the World Series championship team, its value in a few years can be astronomical.

A Toronto company began marketing shirts, balls and more purporting to be signed by Paul Molitor, Robbie Alomar and John Olerud, among others. These were sold through legitimate distributors across North America.

The prized product was a signed baseball bat. For the first time in 100 years of major league history, the top three batters in the American League were all on the same team. The bat would have been quite a coup for any collector's shelf. Unfortunately, the signatures on the bat are definitely false, according to Detective Jim Downs of the Metro Police Intelligence Squad.

"The bats with triple signatures are bogus for sure," said Downs. "There are other things as well, but we can't release that information until we are absolutely sure." The department is currently tracing both hockey and baseball players whose signatures can be

found on hundreds of items from photographs to hockey pucks. But is has left an unfortunate legacy for authentic distributors of autographed memorabilia, John White, a dealer for Baseball Originals, a legitimate company, is concerned that most of his phone calls these days seem to be confusing him with the frandulent companies. "Our autographs come from impeccable sources in the clubhouse and we offer a certificate of authenticity," he said. "But how do our customers know we are any more legit-

imate than the others were; they offered a beautiful certificate of authenticity." Baseball Originals offers autographed balls, including a special two-ball set signed by 1992's and 1993's Blue Jays team members and a bat and ball set signed by the entire team of 1993, "We only have a limited number because we are legitimate," said White. "Ordinarily, these would be gold." One 1993 ball and bat set was recently auctioned on MIX 99 FM for \$4500, with proceeds going to Sick Kids Hospital. But adds White, "These days, no one is sure who to trust."

Detective Downs agrees that the scandal has placed a pall over the sports collectible. field. But there are legitimate operators out there. And he offers one piece of advice; "know who you are buying from. It's like art; you have to trust your dealer, that's all you can do." And, as with art, baseball collectibles can rise astoundingly in value, so buyer beware. Ask about the reputation of your dealer before you invest.
