Halton regional chairman Peter Pomeroy lashed out at developers who packed a meeting on development charges, saying he might abandon a compromise plan. The region uses the money to pay for improvements necessary to new construction.

February

As February began, a six-month jail sentence was handed out to an Etobicoke man who was responsible for a safety violation which cost Tomislav Vukovic his life in an accident during construction of the Milton Leisure Centre.

The Milton Merchants found the going in the Central League's western division tough as they fell to third place while losing all-star defenceman Mike Murray for most of the season with a leg injury. The Merchants, 1991 Central League Champions, were finding out that it is tough to win but tougher to repeat.

A close regional council vote scuttled an attempt by Burlington's Ralph Scholtens to unify smoking

bylaws under regional jurisdiction.

The Milton Winter Carnival was called a great success by optimistic organizers, despite a slight drop in attendance. Highlights of the carnival included a 90-minute show by the Milton Figure Skating Club and a hockey shoot, organized by the Milton Merchants. A magician and town crier (councillor Ron Furik) rounded out the fun.

Milton based KEEP (Keep the Escarpment Environment Protected) won a prestigious environmental award from the Halton Region Conservation Authority. "It's the award that really puts it all in words," said KEEP spokesperson Gwen Isings. "It's really nice."

The province put \$96 million into Highway 401 reconstruction, which will see a 33-kilometre stretch widened from four to six lanes by 1997. In addition, it was announced that construction for the Highway 403 missing link through Burlington would be accelerated. The \$313 million project is expected to be complete by 1998.

A Campbellville woman was robbed at gunpoint while on holiday in Florida. The 74-year-old, who had spent 10 winters in Florida, con-

sidered herself "very, very lucky" to come out of the ordeal intact but shaken. About \$120 and credit cards were stolen.

Two women narrowly escaped injury when an ambulance smashed through the front window of Quality Greens on Main Street.

Snowfall had made the roads slick and apparently caused the ambulance to miss the turn at Main and Martin Streets. The ambulance was carrying a 77-year-old heart attack victim who, despite efforts to resuscitate him, was pronounced dead at Milton District Hospital.

In late February it was announced that Milton District High School would be getting a \$4.7 million facelift. A new track and studio theatre were to be accompanied by additions to the library and guidance centre. The first stage of upgrading finished in the late summer while the second stage is expected to be done by February, 1994.

March

Town council kicked off March with a huge row over which tender to accept for municipal bus service. In the end council decided to keep
