This has already been a great year for sports at Milton secondary schools and it looks like it's going to get even better. The Bishop Reding boys senior basketball team is, quite simply, one of the best in the province.

In a recent Toronto Star poll they were ranked second in the Toronto area behind only Westwood. And in

the province they're ranked third.

Two weeks ago they played in the Streetsville Tigers Classic and made it to the finals against Oakwood, the third-ranked team in the Toronto area. The Royals beat Oakwood 74-66 on the strength of 33 points from Jesse Ogden. That is their third tournament victory already.

They have a 12-2 record and won

their first game in Halton competition handily, 87-41 over Burlington's Aldershot.

The starting lineup features Todd Fuller and Carlo Zoffraneiri at the guard positions and Ogden (6'4"), Matt Parent (6'3") and Blair Pallopson (6'6") at forwards. Peter Stetler and Paul Sewitt are their key men off the bench.

Coach Chris Dooley, who coached the senior girls team to the Halton championship, figures his team's strengths are experience, balanced scoring (six different players in double figures in a recent game) and excellent outside shooting.

Dooley doesn't say it, but you can add a big C in there for coaching. They're not a particularly big team, and they had some problems on the boards against Oakwood, but they make up for it with their disciplined style. That, and almost unbelievable accuracy at the three-point range.

Milton District High School had a perfect 5-0 tournament record when they started league play, but got off to a bit of a rocky start, losing to powerhouse M.M. Robinson of Burlington 68-58 and 59-51 to Assumption in Burlington.

In the Robinson game, the Mustangs fell substantially behind in the first half but almost made a great comeback in the second half when they started popping in three-

pointers from all over the court. Jason McCall led their attack with 18 points.

Coach Henry VandenBerg, in his first year with the Milton team, counts outside shooting, along with team defence, as their strengths. In order to be as successful as their early tournament record promised, however, they will have to be more consistent with their inside game.

VandenBerg has six players who more or less earn equal playing time, with Jason McCall, Anthony Hunter C and Andrew Skinner figuring to lead the point parade.

Todd Dowell (6'3"), Paul Brown (6'6") and Jake Swarbrick (6' 4") € round out their key players. Chris Grimwood and Sean Faulkner are expected to provide the strength from the bench.




