

Whiting claims coalition using intimidation tactics

Dave Whiting says the Taxpayers Coalition of Halton is using in-

timidation tactics on politicians. The coalition sent letters to Mr. Whiting, chair of the Halton Board of Education, and other area

politicians, saying they plan to keep track of how elected officials vote on financial issues.

The organization will grade the politicians according to how they vote. The report cards will be made public.

"They're rating us on what they consider important," Mr. Whiting said. "They're looking for us to cut spending. But philosophically it's prudent to look at what we're cutting and where we're cutting, be-

cause we have 45,000 kids in the system that we have to put first."

Mr. Whiting is afraid the media will not convey the politicians' side of the story when the report cards are released, he said.

Coalition president Frank Gue said Mr. Whiting has it all wrong.

"Whiting is flogging the same sacred cow and it's absolutely not true," he said. "We're looking at quality for your dollar, exactly what you are looking for when you shop

for meat or your automobile."

Not only will the group be looking at issues which involve money, but also those which involve quality, he said.

"Canada has one of the highest education costs in the developed world and we do not perform well internationally," Mr. Gue said.

Mr. Gue's organization, which has 650 members, including "only a handful" from Milton and Halton Hills, has already started collecting information in order to begin the report cards, he said.
