

Milton Heights Ski Club advances to circuit final

The Milton Heights Hershey Alpine Red team advanced to the circuit final, the first team to do so in the ski club's history, finishing third among the five teams that qualified recently.

The giant slalom race at Georgian Peaks saw Devil's Elbow finish first, Mansfield second, Hidden Valley fourth and Caledon fifth.

Milton Heights' top three girls were Maria Fredriksson of Milton with a combined time of 69.15 seconds, Tammie Wilson of Bur-

lington with a combined time of 70.07 seconds and Kathy Shier of Limehouse, who finished in 70.20 seconds.

Milton Heights' top three boys were Kevin Martin of Campbellville in 61.82 seconds, Roni Couper of Burlington in 63.21 seconds and Jason Baetz of Milton, who crossed in 63.53 seconds.

Mid-February was spent training at home and it paid off with some big wins.

The Mackenzie Gold Team travelled to Craighleith on Feb. 19 for a five way semifinal slalom race with 65 skiers participating. Milton was third with 330 points. Craighleith was first with 520, Caledon second with 394, Devil's Elbow fourth with 196 and Chicopee fifth with 156 points.

Milton's top three girls were Susie

Davis of Oakville who was 33rd in 99.03 seconds, Jessica Cripps of Rockwood with a time of 100.44, who was 34th, and Lindsay Locke of Oakville, who finished in 101.78 and was 36th overall.

The top three local boys were Jonathan Stapleton of Oakville who was 12th in 86.57 seconds, Scott de Lottinville of Hamilton who was 14th in 87.93 seconds and Dustin Saaris of Burlington who was 20th in 89.89.

Milton's Mackenzie Silver team travelled to Devil's Glen on February 20 for a five way semifinal. Milton finished fifth.

The Hershey Alpine Green Team travelled to London to participate in a five way semifinal slalom race on the same day. The Greens were third behind London and Kimberly.

The Hershey Alpine White team

journeyed to Devil's Elbow and raced in a five way semifinal, finishing fourth.

Leslie Grell of Oakville, Kelsey McKnight of Dundas and Michaila Cook of Oakville were the top female Milton finishers. Among the boys Colin Martin, Kyle Martin and Sean Johns completed a Campbell-

ville sweep of Milton's top spots.

The Hershey Alpine Red team hosted a three way semifinal at Glen Eden with the home side winning to advance to the final.

Kathy Shier, Maria Fredriksson, Carolyn Yarrow, Kevin Martin, Jason Baetz and Tom Hughes led the way for the winners.

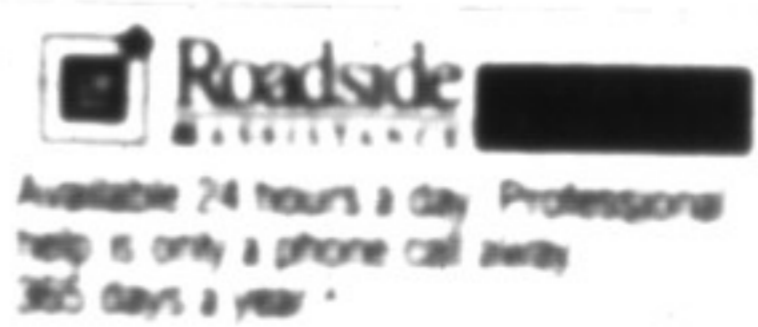
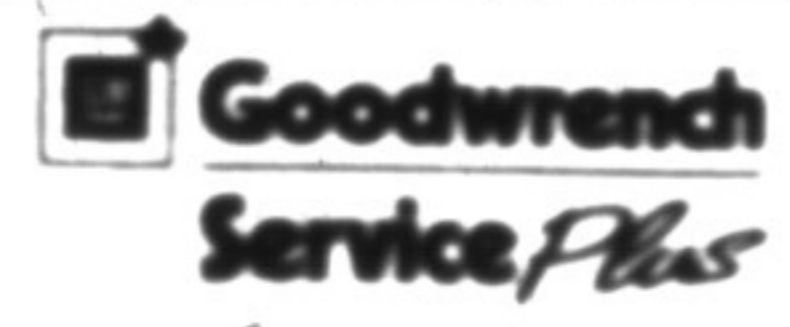
