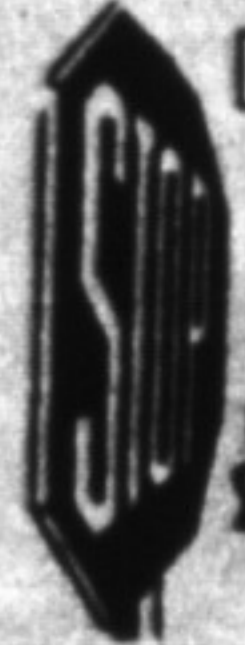

Healthy habits fostered at latest Wellness Fair

There will be at least 25 things to do at this Saturday's Wellness Fair.

The Milton Mall event, which promotes healthy lifestyles, will continue its tradition as a hands-on show, says Cindy McDonnell, education and quality assurance co-ordinator for Milton District Hospital.

"We really want to avoid a fair where there's booth after booth of pamphlets," says Ms McDonnell, chairperson of the hospital's Community Education Committee.

The committee is organizing the fifth annual fair with funding from the Milton District Hospital Foundation.

This year's event will be the biggest ever with 25 participants, each inviting visitors to become actively involved in their displays, Ms McDonnell says.

Interest in the fair has also been on the rise, she says. "We've had more calls (from groups) asking to be in it."

Visitors will be able to learn about blood typing (from the Canadian Red Cross Society), foot care (Victorian Order of Nurses), and quality of life for seniors (Allendale).

Milton District Hospital will have information available on diabetes, audiology, blood pressure, the Heimlich manoeuvre, physiotherapy, ultrasound, healthy weight, battling germs and general medicine.

Booths will be set up on carbon monoxide analysis (courtesy of the Halton Lung Association), nutrition for babies (La Leche League), AIDS (Halton Regional Health Department), hearing loss (Canadian Hearing Society) and healthy eating (Heart and Stroke Foundation).

New this year are booths promoting the Halton Regional Police Service's DARE Program, an anti-drug program for youths; reflexology; mammography and breast care; laparoscopic surgery; and the Home Emergency Lifeline Program (HELP). The Wellness Fair will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
