very serious statement but this is a very serious matter."

Mr. Field said the new law contradicts "the right of each one of us to be regarded as the equal of every other citizen before or under the law."

During his 90-minute presentation, he remarked on how there has been no public forum to discuss the ongoing immigration problems in Canada, and how he is frustrated over bilingualism being forced on Canadians as an official policy, as well as taxpayer-funded multiculturalism.

"Now we know it (multiculmeans special laws for special people and the funding of members. causes which are often in the worst interests of Canada."

He added that government-funded multiculturalism creates the ability to start political groups which divide and separate Canadians.

"I am not a politician and this is not a political group by any means. We are a voice of freedom.

"Above all, we encourage all Canadians, regardless of origin, to stand and be counted. 'Political correctness' is the refuge of cowards and charlatans. People who use such tactics do not understand the obligations and responsibilities of a free and open democratic society."

Halton Multiculturalism Council President Willie Campos said that while the employment equity law is not perfect, he does agree with the intention — to correct job discrimination that has gone on in the

"With regards to multiculturalism, our role at the council is to help people from all groups and backgrounds, in business matters and otherwise," said Mr. Campos, who added that bilingualism should be considered a privilege and not a bur-

"This group (Voice of Canadians Committee) says these policies separate Canadians, but it is in fact they who wish to divide us through their underlying bigotry."
