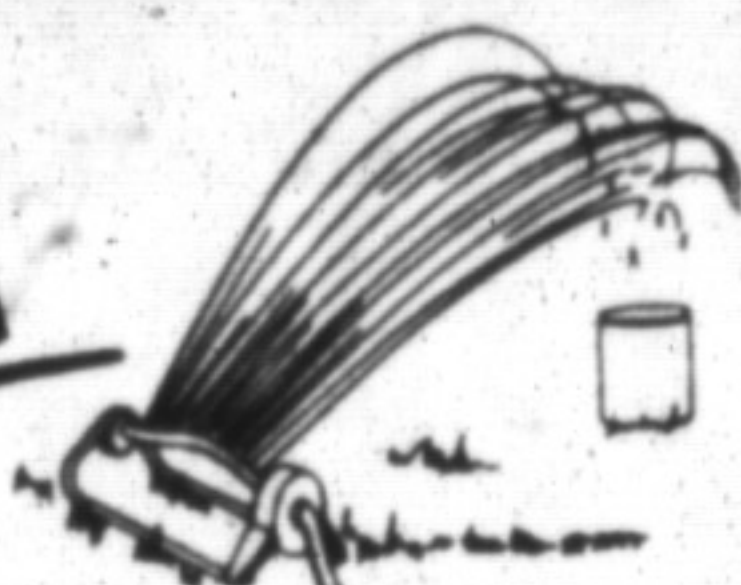


Lose a woman's gold bracelet?

Turf Tips



WATERING

Are you watering your lawn properly? Your lawn needs 3 to 4 cm (1 to 1 1/2 inches) of water weekly. Deep, heavy waterings are better than light sprinklings. Thorough waterings, twice weekly, encourage strong, healthy roots that reach deep into the soil. Light waterings encourage shallow, weak roots and promote weed grass infestations.

When a lawn requires water, it takes on a dark haze with a silvery tinge. If you walk on a lawn with these dark patches, your footprints will be visible. Early morning is the best time to water. Midday watering during hot, dry weather, can waste water, since much of the water evaporates. However, if the lawn shows dark or orange patches due to drought, water it immediately regardless of the time of day. To be sure you are irrigating your turf thoroughly, sprinklers should be on full for at least an hour to provide one inch of water to the lawn.
