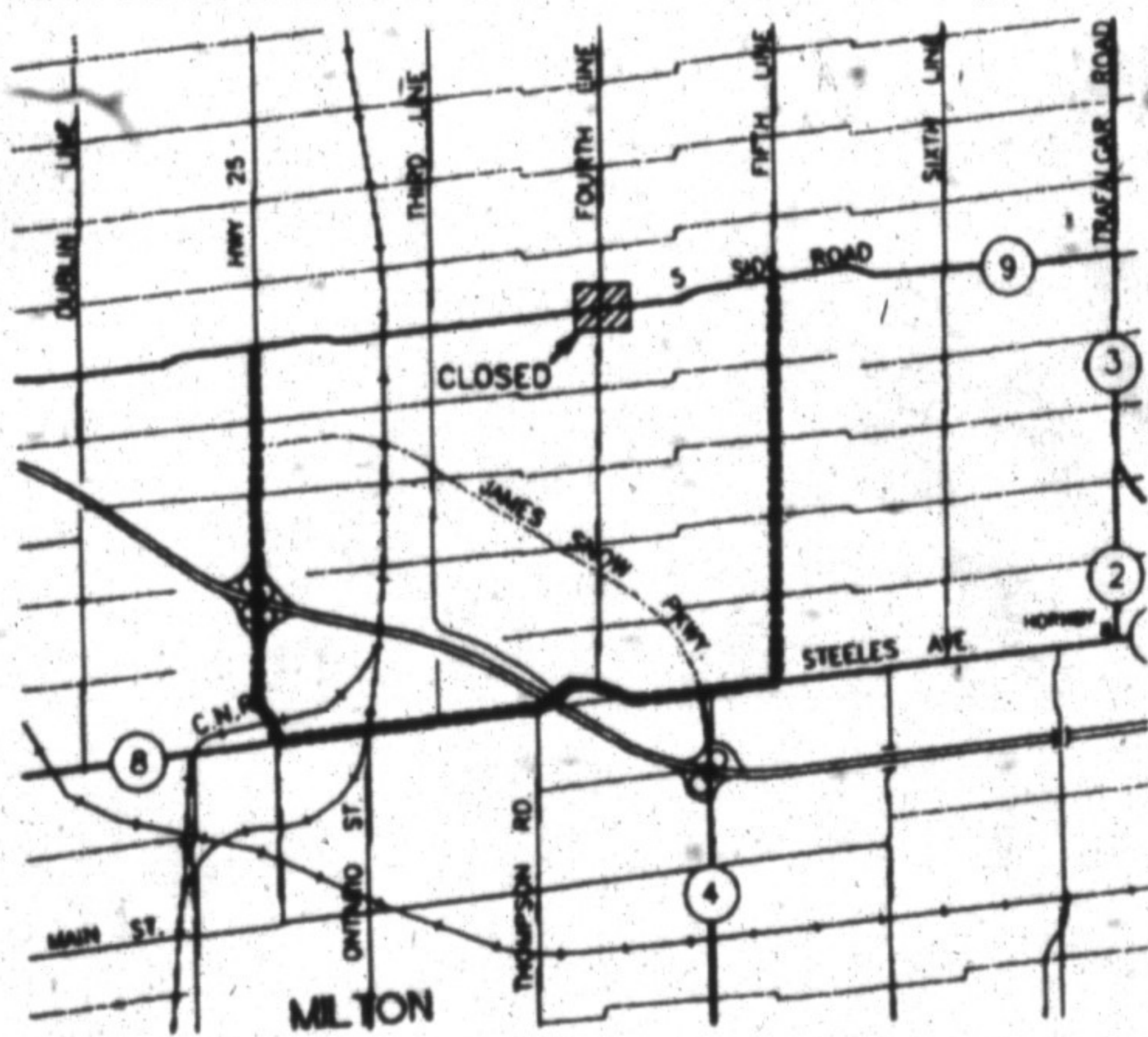
PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT PUBLIC NOTICE - ROAD CLOSURE

The Fourth Line will be temporarily closed to through traffic between Steeles Avenue and No. 10 Sideroad in the Towns of Milton and Halton Hills effective **Monday, July 4, 1994 to Monday, August 15, 1994** to facilitate the road reconstruction and knoll removal at the intersection of Regional Road No. 9 and Fourth Line.
