Good tournament show

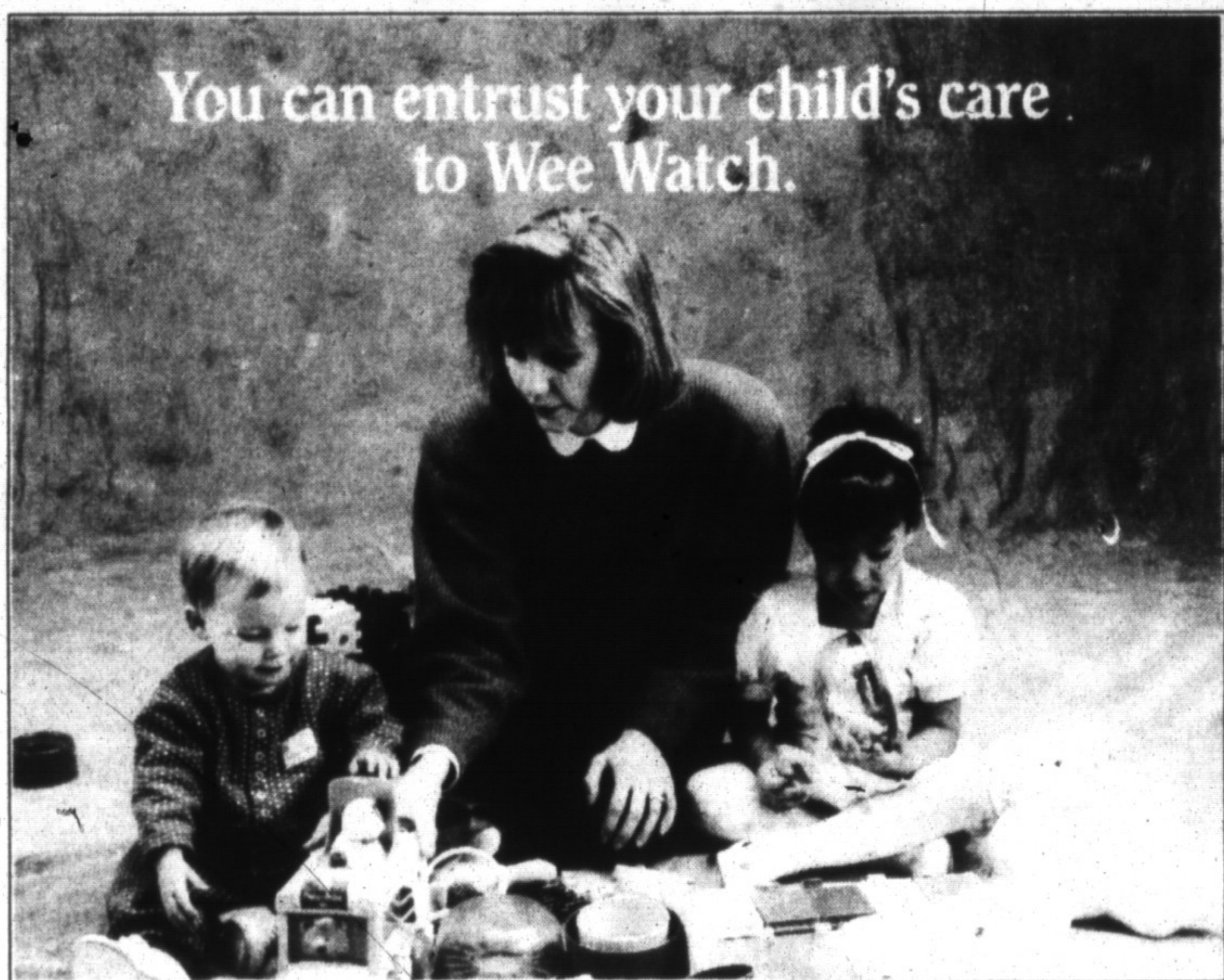
