#### Cops want answers

Police are asking for assistance from the public after a seven-year-old Milton girl reported that a stranger told her to get in his car Wednesday.

The girl was walking along Kingsleigh Court near Glenn Crescent at about noon when a man in a small red vehicle stopped and said, "Please, get into my car," the girl told Halton Regional Police.

A six-year-old girl standing nearby saw the seven-year-oldrun away from the car and obtained a partial plate number - 369, which could either be the first three numbers or the last three, said Det. Sgt. Ron

The driver of the car is described as male, white, in his 20s, with short, dark hair. He was wearing glasses. The front end of the car was black.

Det. Sgt. Welsh said the incident could be either serious or a misunderstanding and "totally innocent," and is asking for the public's help in getting to the bottom of it.



### \$700 million plan backed by councillors

The Halton Urban Structure Plan (HUSP) is ready to move ahead another step as 20 recommendations setting the stage for negotiations for the total \$700 million plan - \$550 million for water and sewage, another \$150 million for other regional services, such as roads — received regional committee approval Wednesday.

A 132-page HUSP financing report was presented at a joint planning and public works/administration and finance committee. It held three financial scenarios — conventional public sector growth funding, private-public sector partnership or HUSP rejection.

Conventional financing would create high builder development charges and mean an initial \$200 million funding gap. HUSP rejection was similarly undesirable after eight years' work and the steady march of growth in Halton.

Regional staff recommended **HUSP** financing involve partnerships among the region, benefitting landowners, a private sector consortium and the province.

If approved by regional council next week, staff will have authority to test the waters and seek out those partnerships.

The HUSP is a comprehensive planning document that, Burlington Mayor Walter Mulkewich said, "would allow Halton to manage future growth as opposed to being victimized by it."

Milton Mayor Gord Krantz moved Wednesday's recommendations, saying it would be "folly" not to forge ahead now.

"Simply saying no to growth will not make the problem go away," said Mr. Krantz.

He referred to the "hard lessons" in Oakville and Burlington in the late 1970s and early 1980s, when the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) and SeePLAN page 8


