Summer work outlook brighter

The job situation for students this summer is brighter than in recent years, according to the Canada Employment Centre for Students.

"It is better than last year," said Sandra Bang, summer employment officer. "Things are improving."

The centre, located in Trafalgar

Square, 310 Main St E., has been open since May, matching job vacancies with students — from high schools, colleges and universities — hoping to earn some extra money.

The majority of youths currently seeking work are highschool students, who have recently completed the school year, said Ms Bang, a 21-year-old university student. Most post-secondary students, who finish

about a month earlier, have already found summer employment.

Students looking for work may register at the centre by filling out a form, which requires such information as name, address, telephone number, the student's skills and type of work desired.

Youths can also sign up for the 'odd job squad,' a popular program which hires students on a temporary basis to perform various tasks.

Jobs available this summer, Miss Bang said, include the usual — restaurant help, clerical positions, outdoor jobs, sales and retail work and farm help.

Miss Bang said on average about 25 to 35 job vacancies are posted at the centre daily, but numbers vary.

Those in need of help with their resumes can get assistance from centre staff as well as through resource material, or by taking part in a workshop on creative job search techniques.

The centre is open until July 25 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday, but closed from noon to 1 p.m. However, after July 25, job opportunities will be posted at the Canada Employment Centre, also located in the plaza.

Students can also call 845-2959, a tele-message job vacancy service.

Employers interested in hiring a student can simply call the centre at 878-8418.

No tax sex, cops say

Two people face public mischief charges for allegedly lying to police by reporting a false incident of extortion.

In November, a man and a woman who were business partners told police a 46-year-old Mississauga man who they hired to complete their income tax return asked for sex from the woman in exchange for the \$700 they owed him.

Halton Regional Police charged the Mississauga man with extortion on November 16.

But before the trial began Tuesday in Milton provincial court, the pair couldn't go through with testifying, police said.

A 27-year-old Lower Base Line woman and a 26-year-old Brampton man face public mischief charges.
