Square, 310 Main St E., has been open since May, matching job vacancies with students - from highschools, colleges and universities hoping to earn some extra money.

The majority of youths currently seeking work are highschool students, who have recently completed of work desired. the school year, said Ms Bang, a 21year-old university student. Most post-secondary students, who finish

about a month earlier, have already found summer employment.

Students looking for work may register at the centre by filling out a form, which requires such information as name, address, telephone number, the student's skills and type

Youths can also sign up for the 'odd job squad,' a popular program which hires students on a temporary basis to perform various tasks.

Jobs available this summer, Miss Bang said, include the usual restaurant help, clerical positions, outdoor jobs, sales and retail work and farm help.

Miss Bang said on average about 25 to 35 job vacancies are posted at the centre daily, but numbers vary.

Those in need of help with their resumes can get assistance from centre staff as well as through resource material, or by taking part in a workshop on creative job search tech-

The centre is open until July 25 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday, but closed from noon to 1 p.m. However, after July 25, job opportunities will be posted at the Canada Employment Centre, also located in the plaza.

Students can also call 845-2959, a tele-message job vacancy service.
