making the Mill Pond a passive area for residents and now the people using that facility won't be able to use it because of the traffic," said Ms Delacourt.

"I think there are plans afoot that we should be told about. They're thinking about putting a 20,000 square foot addition on Martin House (adjacent to the Mill Pond) for the (Halton regional) museum.

"I think the underlying reason for the three lanes is to facilitate traffic

that will probably take place if they do that," said Ms Delacourt.

With Martin Street reconstruction between Steeles Avenue and Chisholm Drive also looming, and mention of upgrades (not widening) between Steeles and Woodward avenues, Main Street resident Pat Duignan said it seems like a "divide and conquer" approach.

"The mayor said he understands the emotions but stressed nothing untoward is afoot.

"I've heard this before. Some peo-

ple see something sinister with the museum but plans for Martin Street have been in the works long before the museum," said Mr. Krantz. The mayor "categorically" denied road widening was linked to the museum plans. The timing is just "coincidence," he said.

Resident Sue Leeder said road widening goes against the Destiny Milton town growth framework study's emphasis on promoting pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

Mr. Krantz said he hopes pedestrian and vehicular traffic can exist in harmony.

"The Mill Pond trails are encouraging pedestrian traffic but that's not to suggest we'd be diverting vehicular traffic onto other routes," he said.

The town has hired an arborist, done on most construction projects involving tree disturbance, said the mayor. Mr. Matthews said tree disease, age and tree strength is being investigated, but no final report is in.

Ms Delacourt was recently annoyed at discovering a man studying trees in her front yard.

"There's no one that would protect trees more than I will but you have to be well aware that trees have a life span. It would be foolhardy to think trees will last forever," said Mr. Krantz.

Recently Milton received provincial funding toward the \$835,000 Martin Street reconstruction between Woodward Avenue and Main Street.
