Urban growth has shifted traffic and increased volumes and accidents, making an all-way stop at Lower Base

Line and Ninth Line necessary, municipal officials say. "There have been increasing accidents reported at the intersection . . . adjacent to the City of Mississauga," said a report to council last week from town public works director John Matthews.

Councillors approved an all-way stop but asked staff to investigate the possibility of wiring flashing stop signs instead of a flashing overhead light at the intersection.

Ward 2 Councillor Brad Clements said it was his belief such flashing overhead lights could be dangerous. He pointed to a similar light at Steeles Avenue and Tremaine Road. That light flashes red in two directions and yellow in two directions, which the councillor believes to be a source of confusion and potentially a factor in a recent fatality at that intersection.

"I'm opposed to that type of warning light," said Mr.

While Mr. Matthews said the signal lights are accepted province-wide, staff agreed to investigate how much increased cost would be involved in wiring the stop

The Town of Milton and City of Mississauga are splitting the cost of the new stop signs.

Ninth Line is a boundary road between the two municipalities. It's maintained by Milton on a cost-shared basis with Mississauga. Lower Base Line is called Eglinton Avenue in Mississauga. Historically, Lower Base Line had the most traffic, however urban development in Mississauga and Oakville has shifted traffic patterns since 1989, giving Ninth Line more traffic.

The intersection's all-way stop will cost \$5,250, with Milton paying 50 per cent. The intersection will get oversized stop signs, stop bar markings on the pavement and speed limits in all directions from the intersection will be reduced from 80 or 70 km/hr to 60 km/hr.




