

Women's groups stage vigil Sept. 22 against violence

Halton women will unite in the fight against violence during the Take Back the Night walk Thursday, Sept. 22.

The fourth annual candlelight walk for women, which symbolizes their right and wish to roam safely without needing male chaperones, will be held in Burlington.

A rally will begin at 6:30 p.m. at the Central Park bandshell on Seneca Avenue (off New Street), west of Guelph Line.

The program will include speakers Donna McElroy and Ted Bober, both feminist therapists, and music from feminist singer Batsheva. A sign language interpreter will be on hand for the hearing impaired.

Men are welcome to attend the rally. An information program for them will take place as the women are walking.

Following the walk to city hall and back, anyone may speak into a microphone and

express their experiences or concerns with violence against women.

Information on services and other organizations will be on display. Books and other items will be for sale.

The event is sponsored by the Halton Rape Crisis Centre, the Women's Information and Support Centre of Halton, Halton Women's Place, COHR Family Services, the Women of Halton Action Movement, AWARE, the

Halton Women's Teacher's Association and Futures.

Participants are asked to wear white and purple and bring signs, noise-makers and a non-perishable food donation for Halton Women's Place. Take Back the Night is held annually by women around the world. It was first organized internationally in the 1970s.

knowledgeable at a younger age than perhaps they were 25 years ago. Mr. Ambeault says, the organization has expanded its program to keep up with the times.

Cubs and Scouts can now earn badges in computers and space exploration. New this year in the badge program — which encourages youths to expand their horizons — are subjects such as Canadian heritage.

Mr. Salla says he's optimistic that Scouting will make a comeback because "society is starting to go back to more traditional values."

Whatever the future has in store, Scouting will always have a colourful past. Scouting began in 1907 when Lt.-General Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell took a group of boys to a camp on Brownsea Island.

The movement grew and was incorporated as the Boy Scout Association throughout the Commonwealth through a Royal Charter granted by King George in 1912.

Scouting came to Canada in the spring of 1908 — just months after the book 'Scouting for Boys' was published in England. The Boy Scout Association was incorporated by an Act of the Canadian Parliament in 1914.

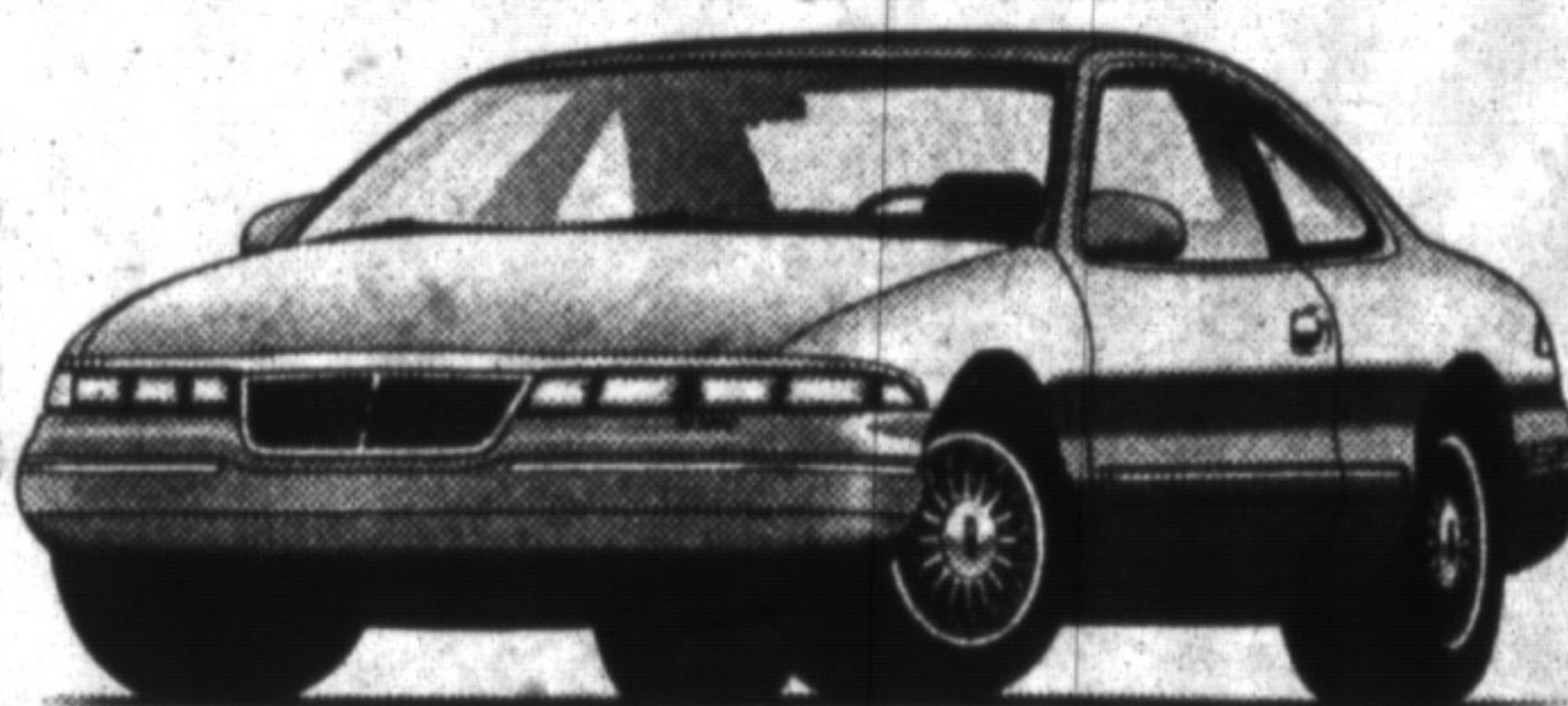

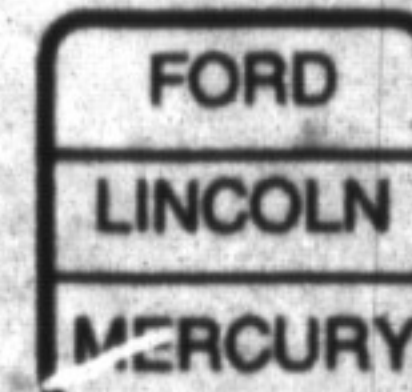
