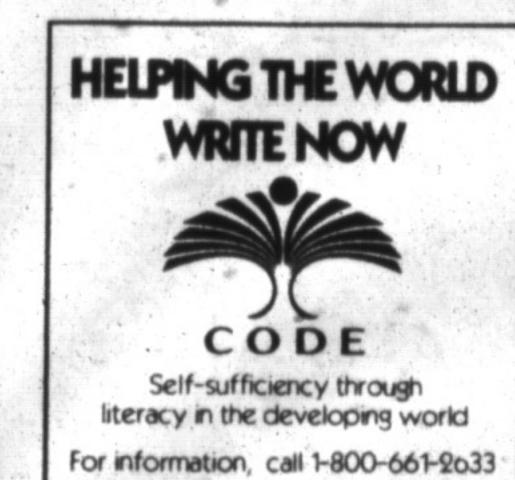

If you've ever thought of writing, but decided you didn't know how, join Lynda McKenzie's journal writing workshop at Milton Public Library.

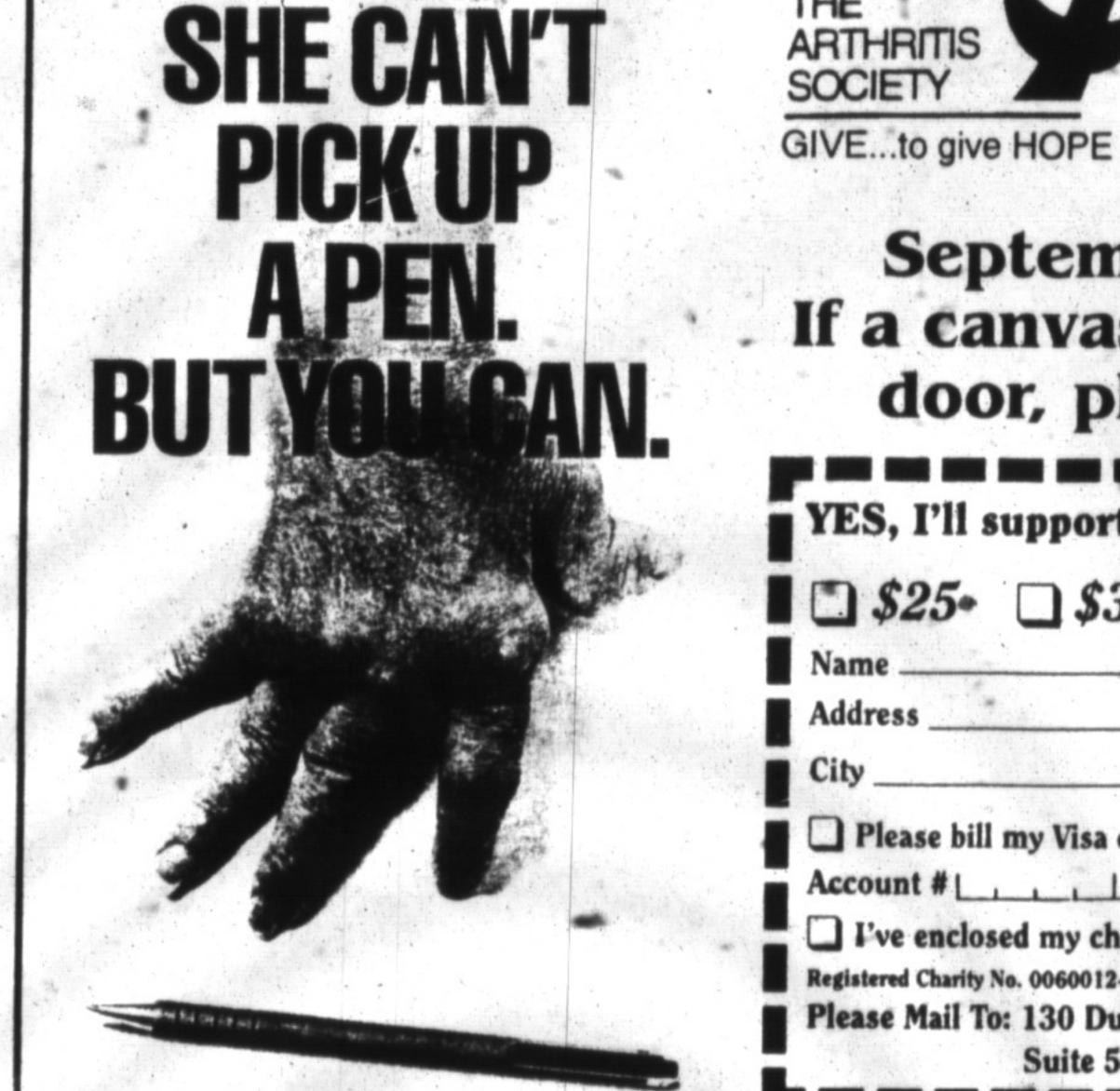
The workshop will be held Tuesdays, October 4, 11, 18 and 25 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.
