## Pomeroy will relinquish job, blasts council over legal fees

Halton regional chair Peter Pomerey, amid criticism of taxpayers financing his legal fees under a new regional bylaw, announced Wednesday he won't seek re-election in November, and would step down immediately if council so voted.

Apologizing for councillors having to "suffer through this current malaise that permeates this region," Mr. Pomeroy added, "I have never seen anything in my experience to rival what's happening at this time. A cancer currently pervades this municipality.


