## Landfill etiquette still source of controversy

For the second time in as many weeks, Halton staff were sent back to do more homework on discontent at the Milton dump, following Wednesday's regional planning and public works committee meeting.

Regional council recently reduced dumping fees for garbage loads over the \$5/150kg limit to 15 cents per additional kilogram. It means anyone dumping, for example, 160kg would pay \$6.50 instead of the \$24 duced six months ago.

Two weeks ago, staff acknowledged the fee concern, recommended the change and otherwise reported that the fee was a success in recouping operating costs for the waste container station (not landfill or recycling).

Milton Councillor Barry Lee hit the roof at what he saw as a lack of acknowledgement of problems in that report, and its premature arrival at committee.

After a meeting with Mayor Gord Krantz and Mr. Lee, staff were back Wednesday recommending user fees include an option to pay \$1.50 per household garbage bag to a \$5 maxi-

The committee also heard from Milton residents with complaints not just about price. Anne Katz said she felt like a "criminal" when she recently registered over the \$5/150 kg limit, had her driver's licence confiscated, her questions referred to the Region, and was told to pay up when she had only \$10 with her.

Finance commissioner Joe Rinaldo said landfill staff have stopped confiscating driver's licences, will have public relations training this year, and will accept credit cards. There's a fee waiver for groups doing community clean-ups, stepped up regional patrols to hinder illegal dumping and a new internal road to better link

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the dump's entrance and container station.

"So far we've looked at the cosmetics, now we've got to get to the guts of the thing," said Halton Hills Councillor Rick Bonnette.

"I want to get to the bottom of it and get it resolved properly," said Mr. Lee, adding, "This region's motto is 'A World Class Place to Be', surely to God we should be able to figure out how to operate a landfill site to the satisfaction of its residents." 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
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
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
