Two Milton teams chasing titles

The Peel-Halton rep soccer loop is one of the toughest in the country, yet two Milton Youth Soccer Club teams will battle shortly for league titles in one of the strongest area showings in years.

The Lindsey McClaren-Remax under 12 boys reps and their older brothers on the under 16 Milton Optimist squad will both take on Chinguacousy this weekend.

The McLaren-Remax reps, despite losing only three regular season games, didn't win the Peel-Halton league, but they made up for that in playoff action.

Milton downed Caledon 4-1 and Oakville in the semifinal to earn a championship berth.

Milton had tied Oakville twice and lost once during the regular season,

but Remax took charge early on for a one-goal lead in the playoff. However, Oakville knotted it in the late going to force overtime.

The overtime belonged to Milton though, as after 10 minutes they had scored two goals. The turning point was Andrew Casa's marker, and Milton poured on the pressure to win 5-1.

Tomorrow (Saturday) at noon Remax faces Ching at Syntec field (Derry Road, north of Hwy. 401 in Meadowvale).

Ching promises to be tough opposition, having won the Ontario Cup as well as their league.

Strong play is expected from Milton's midfielders Quinn Young, Kyle Grant, Chris Casa, Terry Abraham and Lucas Zamfieri. Stingy

defence is supplied by Keith Dunn, Kornack, Peter Cannataro, Peter Jokic and Ryan Taylor. Carrying the attack will be forwards Orel Martino, Andrew Casa, Ian Robinson, John Taylor and Nason Sipsis. Craig Oliviera minds the net. Coaches Barry Abraham and Tony Casa are confident their players will turn in an outstanding effort, and note that surprises are the norm for this team.

The Optimists have reached the finals after seven years in the Peel-Halton rep program. The Opts play Ching tomorrow (Saturday) morning at 10 a.m. at Bechtel Park in Waterloo.

In previous games, Ching took two victories from Milton and one contest was tied. But Milton is out to regain ground and take the most important prize home.

The Opts reached the final with a comeback win over Dixie last weekend in Cambridge.

Down 2-1 late in the second, Milton staged a two-goal rally in the last 10 minutes. Coach Graham Smith credited a solid defence for the comeback, with acknowledgement to goal scorers Lucas Redditt, Frank Cavello and Andrew Keller, who netted the game winner.

Nancy comes second

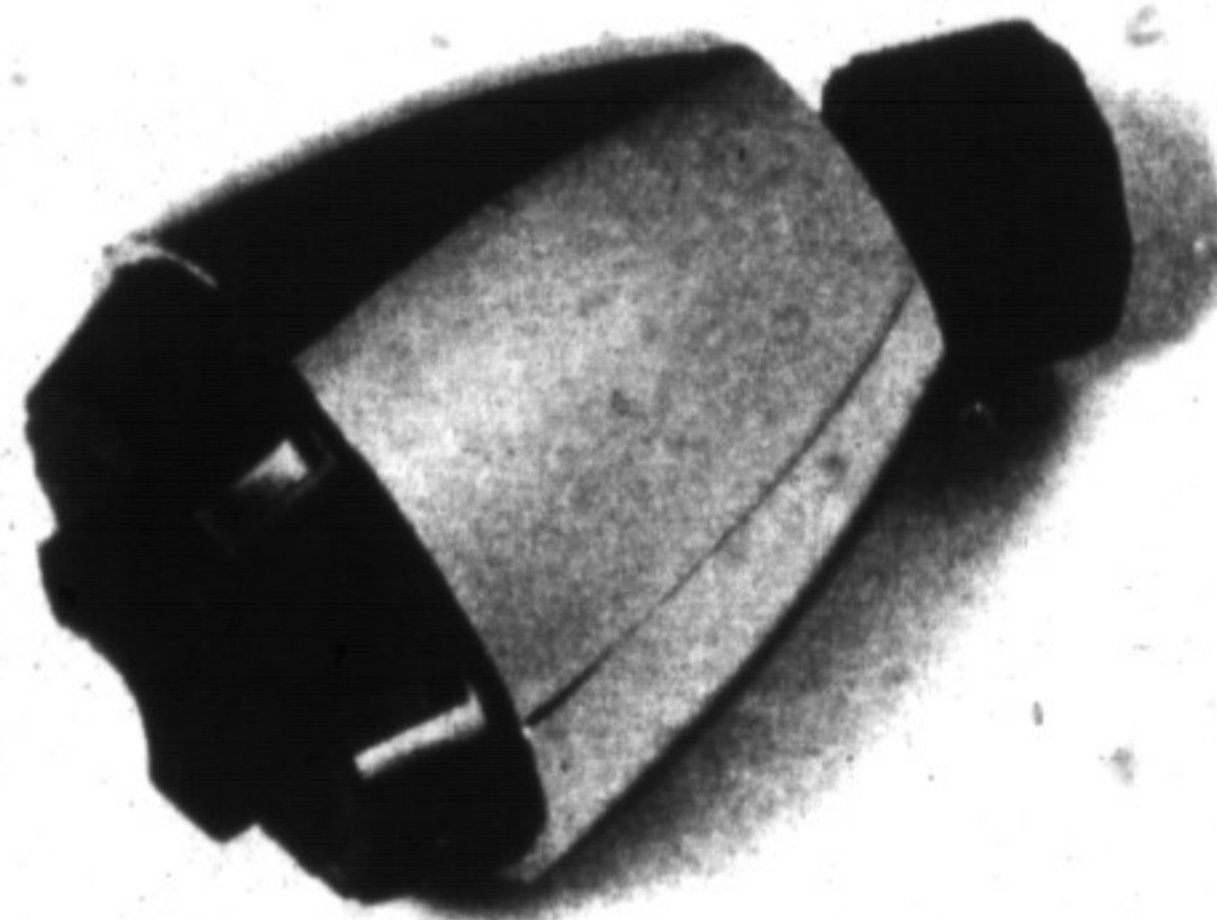

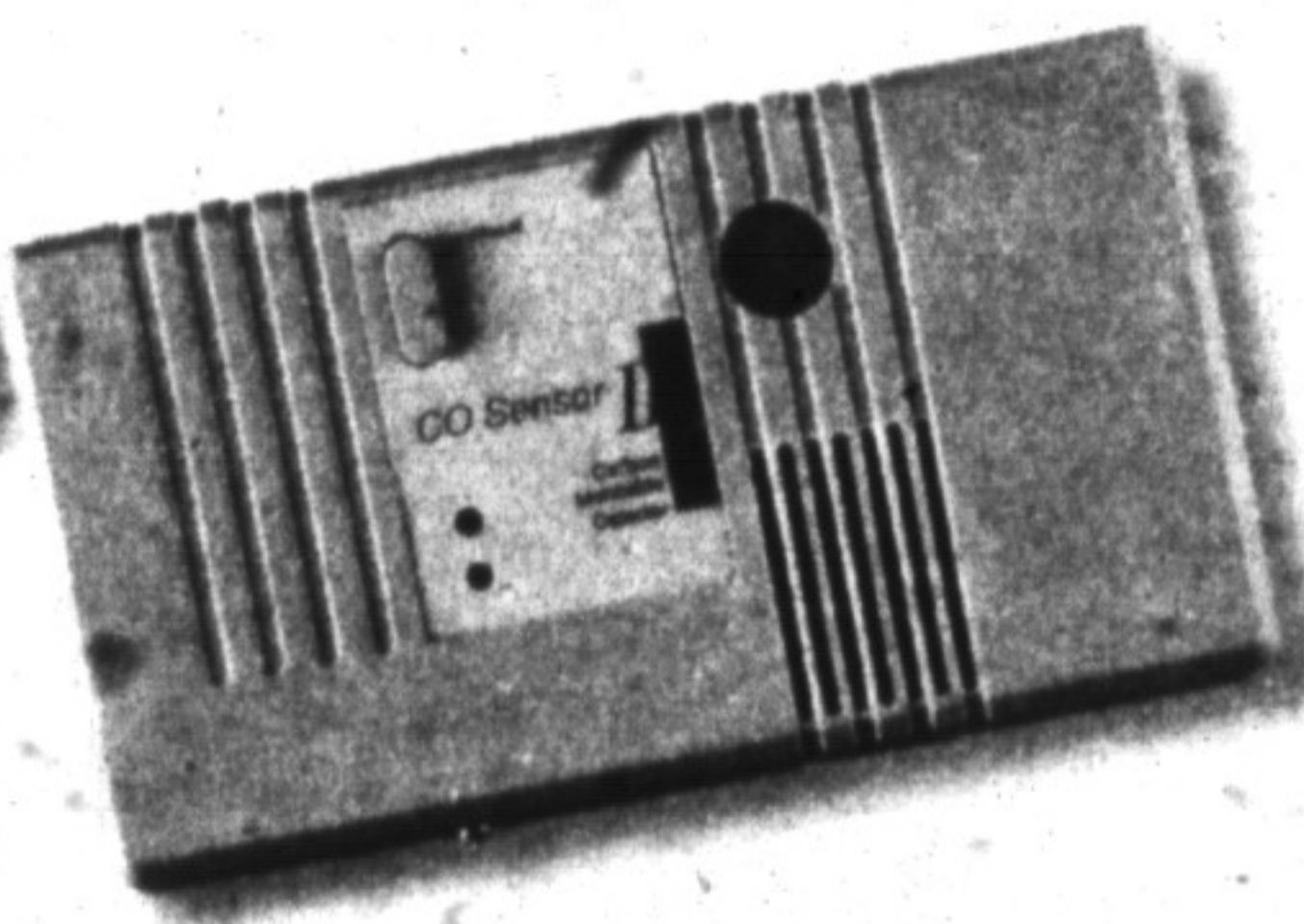

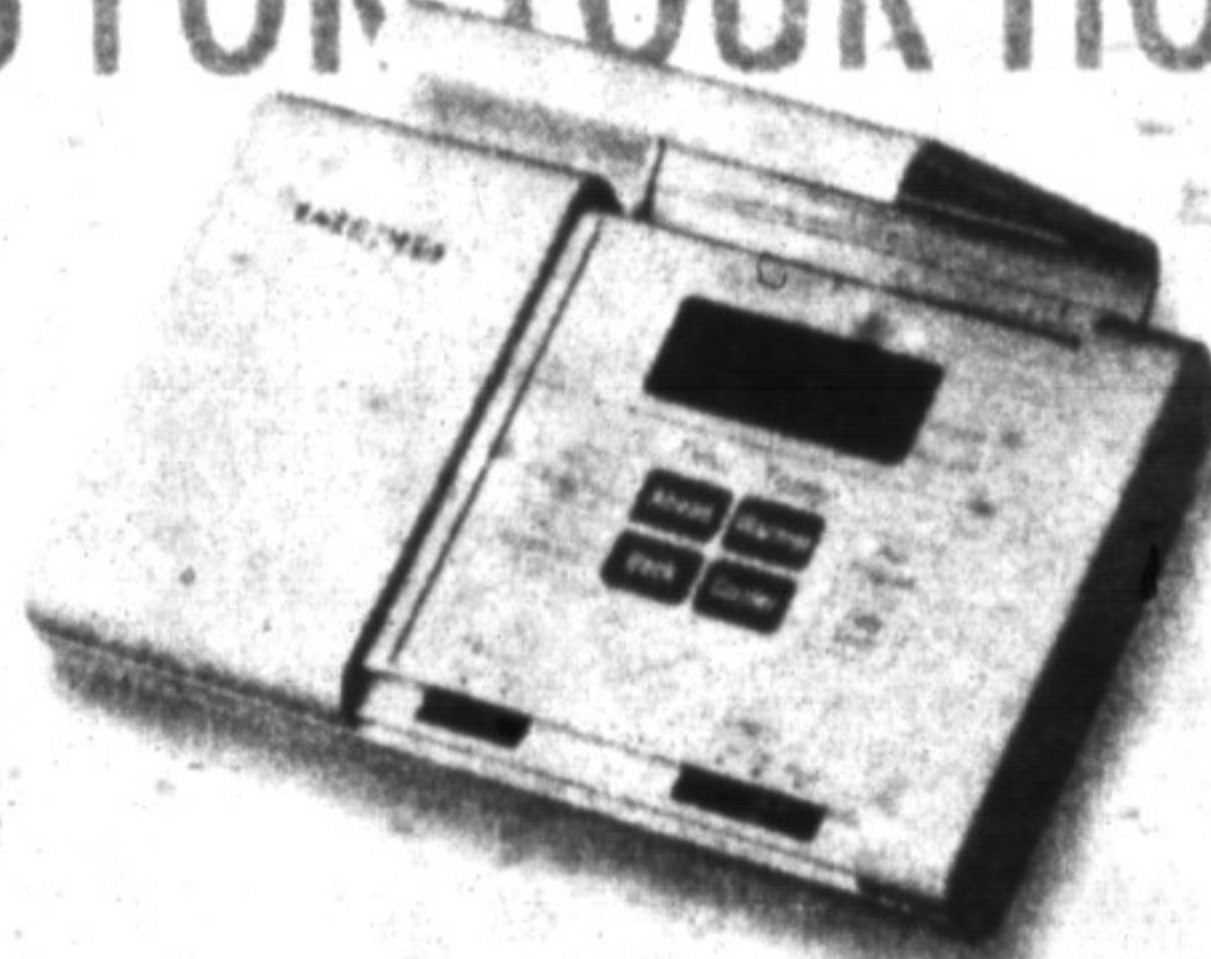
