Hunsinger enters Ward 3 race

Seeking a seat on town council is just a natural progression for 51-year-old Ron Hunsinger, a neophyte politician who has been dealing with the Town from a community perspective for years.

The Ministry of the Environment and Energy employee, who is the coordinator of drinking water research in the Ministry's science and technology branch, has made Nassagaweya home for 22 years. He lives there with his wife of 27 years, Isabel, and three teenage children.

Having mulled over his decision to seek a Ward 3 local council seat since the summer, Mr. Hunsinger said, "It's a natural progression of things. My family and I have always been involved in the community."

The Nassagaweya Community School Association, Nassagaweya Tennis Club and Nassagaweya Fair are some community efforts he helped establish. Mr. Hunsinger has for over half a dozen years been on the Town's leisure services advisory committee and was co-chair of the feasibility study committee for the Leisure Centre.

While his wife is chair of the Town's library board, Mr. Hunsinger is involved with the Town's Destiny

Milton steering committee and land use Committee.

"We've always felt you only get out of the community what you put into it. The move to council is the next logical step in this progression," he said.

An admitted political rookie, Mr. Hunsinger said now that his children are teens, he has time to devote to the job of councillor. He's had encouragement from the community and his family is behind his decision.

"The work I've done through the leisure services advisory committee has given me the experience of deal-

ing with Town staff, and experience dealing with council. I'm comfortable with it. I know a first term for anyone on council is a learning experience but I think I can go up the learning curve fairly quickly."

On the issues, Mr. Hunsinger said, "I think we have to get back to basics," pointing to services the Town is in business to operate — roads, fire protection and waste management.

"There's only so much money to go around but we have to pay more attention to the basics," he said.

Communication is another issue for the Ward 3 candidate. "There isn't adequate communication between the different levels of government," he said, noting in particular the need for communication between the school boards and Town so facilities could be better utilized.

"There is communication at the staff level but it has to also be at the political level."

Of course, water is another concern to the Ministry of Environment researcher. "Obviously drinking water is a very precious resource in a rural community. It's a lifeline, a vulnerable lifeline that we have to pay more attention to," he said.

Recognizing that the rural Nassagaweya community is a vulnerable
