### Pontiac keeps purring with two more wins

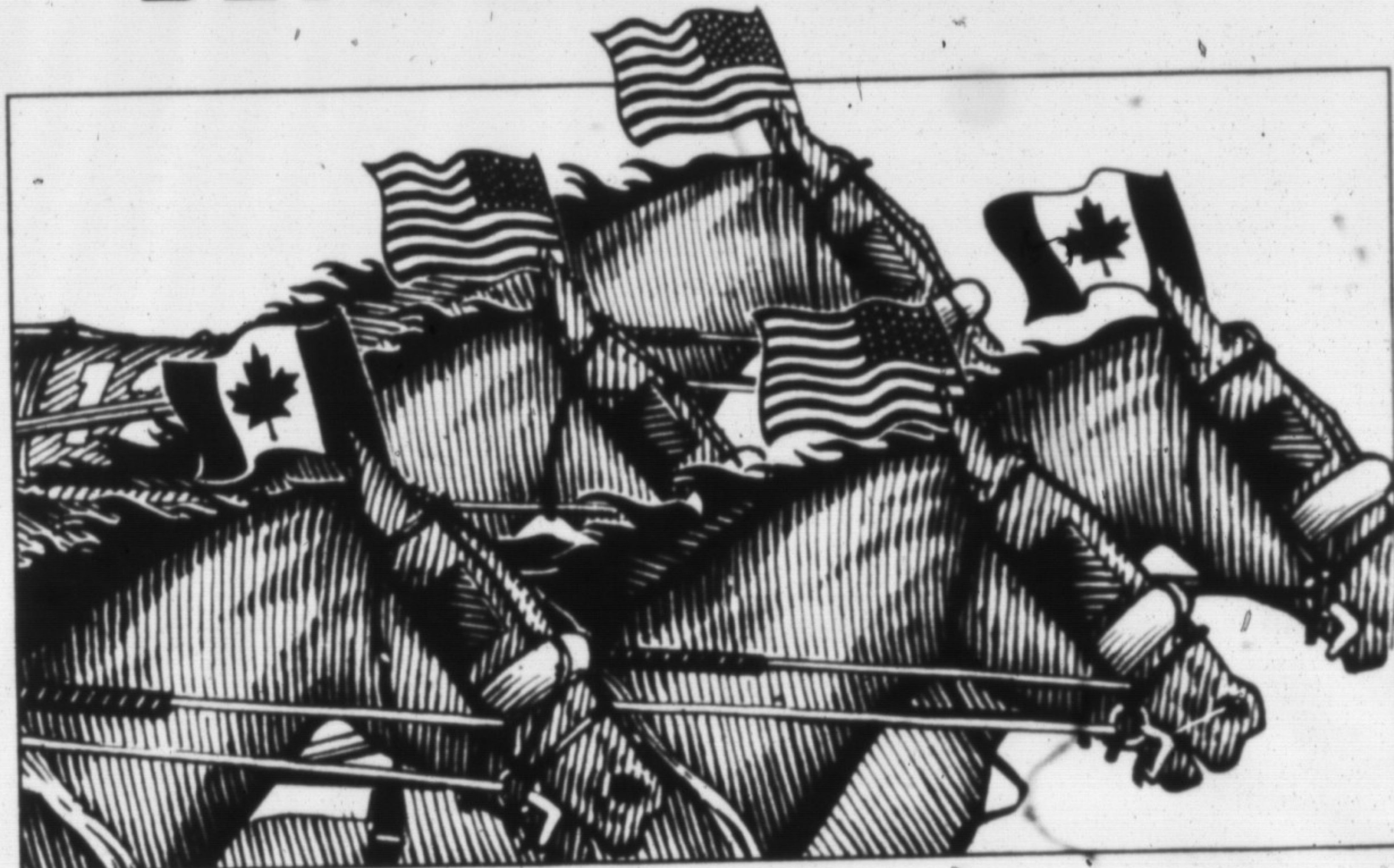
The Wallace Pontiac Buick minor atom A team continued their fine play notching two more wins to run their record to 4-2.
