Novices just miss playoff round in first tournament in Bolton

The Tielemans Interiors minor novice AA team played their first tournament of the season in Bolton, coming up just shy of making it to the playoff round.

Milton defeated Bradford 4-2 in a tense opening game. Bradford was up by a goal after the first period, but Laura Lighthall tied it up in the second when she shoved one over the line in a goal mouth scramble. Robbie Wilson earned the assist.

Milton went ahead with Steven Ellison digging the puck out of the corner and centring it from behind the net to Matt Reed, who flipped it behind the goalie.

The third period saw Milton goalie Corey Clarkson tested beyond his imagination. Reed notched another goal on a rebound from Evan Burrell to put Milton up 3-1, but at the three-minute mark Bradford scored to come within one again. With 2:47 remaining in the game, David

Tielemans passed the puck up to Lighthall, who scored her second of the night.

Exceptional defensive play from Corey Mastrangelo and Jonathan Schultz kept Bradford scrambling in their own end until Matt Mastrangelo took a good penalty on a Bradford breakaway that turned into a questionable penalty shot call. With Corey Clarkson out at the top of the crease to cut down the angle, it offered little for the Bradford skater to shoot at, forcing him to miss wide.

More penalties meant Milton was down two players with one minute remaining, and down three when Bradford pulled their goalie. It was a nail-biting finish with Milton hanging on for the win.

Early Saturday morning Milton faced East Gwillimbury (the eventual tournament winners) in another tight contest.

The first period ended with the Winterhawks ahead on a marker by Ellison from Burrell and Tielemans. During the second period, Milton's defence once again proved unbreakable. Netminder Clarkson stopped a breakaway early, and the constant digging of Mark Galick and Matt Lenardon kept the East Gwillimbury team out of Milton's end until late in the period.

East Gwillimbury took a 2-1 lead into the third and then scored again with Milton short-handed despite strong efforts by Scott Collard and Greg Pepper. Milton pulled their goalie late but to no avail.

In game three, against Stouffville, Milton needed the win to advance since the two teams were tied in the standings. A great hockey game took shape from the start with plenty of scoring opportunities for both sides and superb defence from the Milton team. The game ended in a scoreless draw so it came down to a mathematical formula to break the tie in the standings. That eliminated the Tielemans Interiors novices, a tough way to lose considering the team

gave it 100 per cent for the whole tournament.

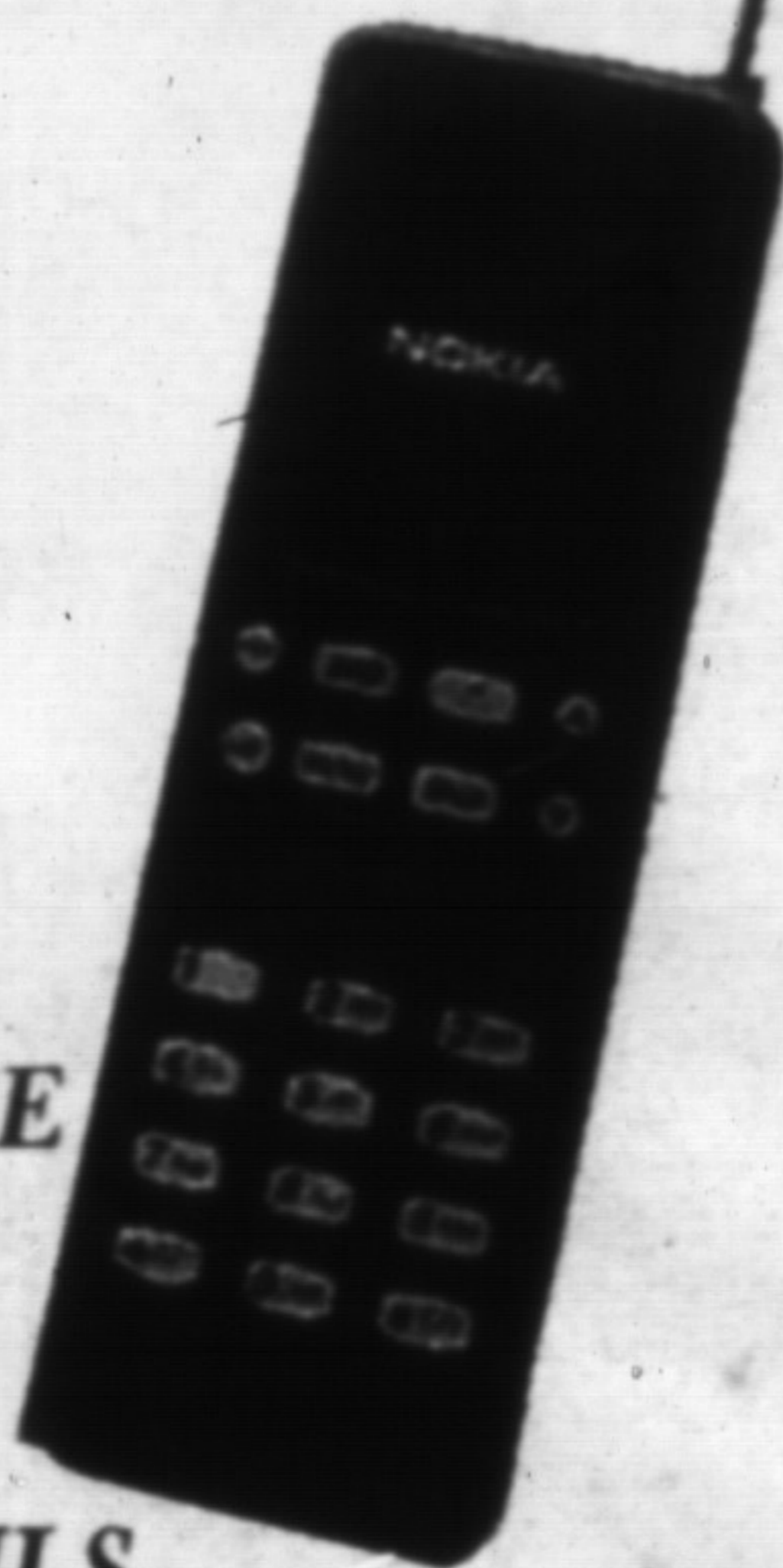
