





Loughlin wins big, opponent gracious

The man who wanted to see a close contest for the job of Ward 2's separate school trustee offered competition, but not near enough to budge incumbent Mary Lou Loughlin out of her Halton Roman Catholic School Board seat.

"I had hoped to do better. I'm disappointed I didn't win, in fact," said 43-year-old Gerry Rooney, a political newcomer who nevertheless tipped his hat to the voters' choice and Ms Loughlin for her hard-fought campaign.

Ms Loughlin easily walked away with over 74 per cent of the vote. That put Ms Loughlin's vote tally at 1,193 over Mr. Rooney's 410 in the two-way campaign. There were 1,603 votes cast by separate school supporters in Ward 2.

"Obviously I'm excited ... thrilled ject manager. and I'm thankful to all the people who worked for me. Whether I expected it (to win), I'm not sure but I'm thrilled to death with it," said Ms Loughlin, 48.

acclaimed in 1991, said she has unfinished work on the school board and gladly anticipates continued contact with the people and children she enjoys working with as a trustee.

"I look forward to another three years of good activities," she said, admitting she campaigned hard, as usual.

The defeated challenger looked to Ms Loughlin's profile in the community as a volunteer and trustee in the schools as telling at the polls. "Obviously her visibility and availability is important to them (voters)," said Mr. Rooney who works in Toronto as a Bank of Montreal pro-

Although Mr. Rooney, a father to three, has held every executive position in the Bishop Reding Catholic Parent Teachers Association over the last six years, he said he'll no longer The incumbent, who was have children in Milton's Catholic high school when the next election rolls around. However, that may not discourage him from seeking election again.

"A lot can happen in three years. I'll wait until two years down the road before thinking about it but my instinct is yes. Losing an election doesn't mean I should run away and hide," he said.
