

Man with knife robbed Martin Street gas bar

A hold-up at a Milton gas station has detectives looking for a silver-coloured car in the hope it will lead them to the culprit.

At about 5:30 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 5, a man entered the Petro Canada on Martin Street near Market Drive. He demanded cash while brandishing a knife. After some money was turned over by the attendant, the suspect walked to the south end of the station's property.

A moment later, an older model silver GM car drove off the lot and turned north on Martin Street.

The man wanted by police is described as white, 25 to 35 years of age and five-foot-nine to six feet tall with a slim build. He had brown hair and wore a blue shirt and jeans.

Robbed 17 banks including local CIBC

'Tilley Bandit' pleads guilty

A Mississauga man dubbed the 'Tilley Bandit' has pleaded guilty to holding up 17 banks, including the Canadian Imperial Bank of

Commerce in downtown Milton.

John Robert Laramie, 48, of Lakeshore Road East robbed banks in 12 Ontario cities and towns between January 14 and October 7.

Just before closing on February 11, he held up the CIBC on Main Street

East in Milton.

Four employees and two customers were in the bank when Laramie, armed with a small handgun, approached a teller and demanded cash shortly before 8 p.m.

The proposed plan, by-law and description showing lands affected, may be viewed in the Clerk's Department at the Town Hall, Victoria Park Square, Milton, Ontario.

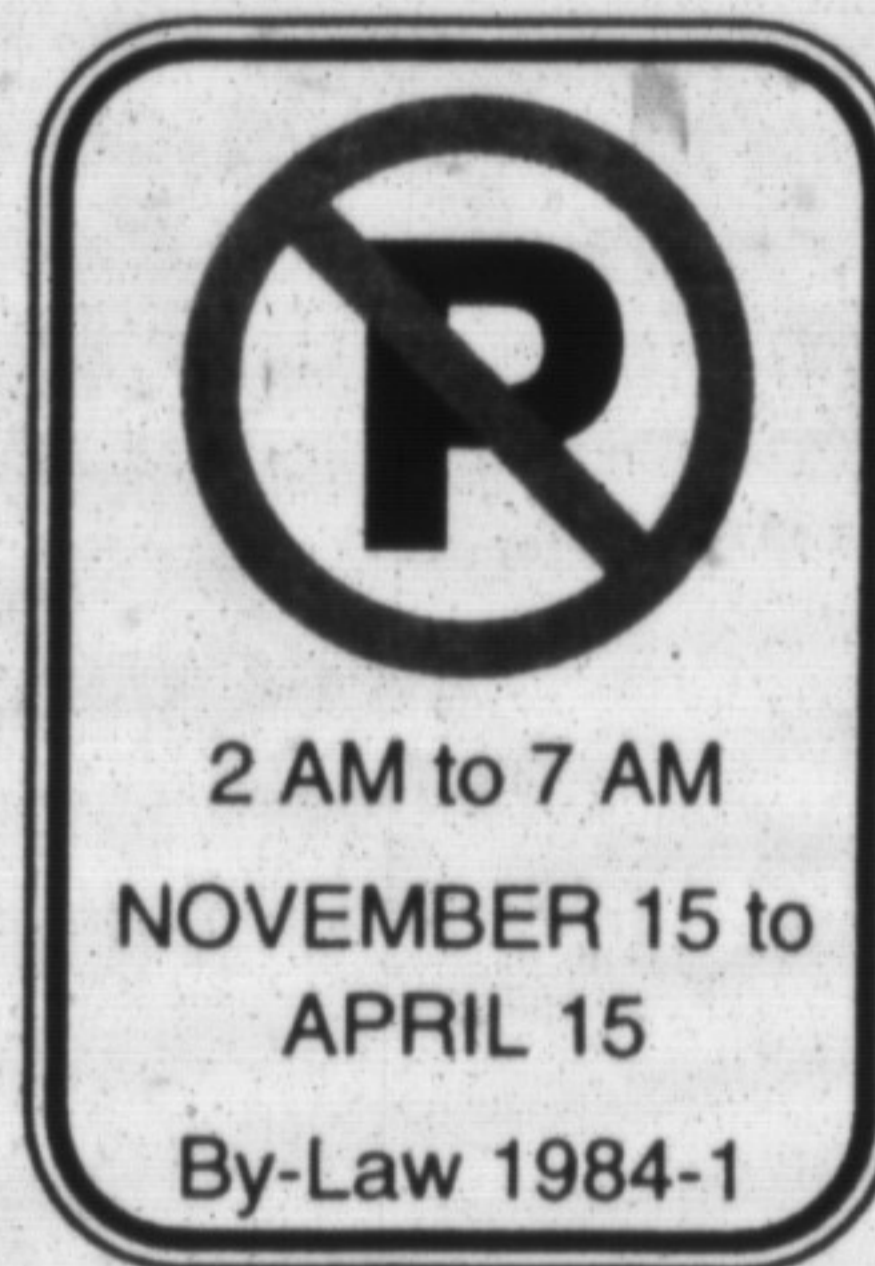
