

# Proposed station gets to score water allotment

 ty at large, it is recommended the water and wastewater allocation required for this police station be allocated at this time and be held in reserve until used," continued planning commissioner Rash Mohammed's report.

Mr. Mohammed said Milton council should be told of the Region's decision "as it represents a slight departure from our previous approach."

Milton's remaining water servicing is the equivalent of only 137 single family homes and the new 28,000 sq. ft. police station to be built on the Allendale site, needs capacity equivalent to two homes.

"What is the current water use for the current police station?" asked Mr. Best. "Maybe it's just a matter of transferring capacity from the old to the new (station)," he suggested.

While staff will find the information he requested, the committee will recommend to council this week that

the allocation be made now.

Mr. Best said water servicing has been found in regard to building and upgrades at Allendale, Milton District Hospital, Bishop Reding Secondary School, for non-profit housing, Maplehurst Correctional Institute and now the new police station.

Mr. Best also sought assurances from regional staff that the new facility would use water-efficient fixtures. "Institutional users are heavy water users," he explained.

The incoming regional councillor acknowledged it's still under discussion what will happen to the current police station site on King Street, and said transferring the capacity may not be possible should it affect the property's salability.

In a November 1 memo to Halton Region, Halton Regional Police Services Deputy Chief of Administration Ean Algar provided details of the new police station and its water usage expectations with a view to securing service allocation.

The station will sit on approximately 3.5 acres north of Allendale. It's expected to be finished in April, 1996. The project's \$3.75 million cost was provided through the Canada/Ontario Infrastructure Works Program, which sees one-third of the

project's tab picked up by each of the federal, provincial and municipal government levels.

The new police station will accommodate 22 people at any one time. When it opens, the station will house 40 officers, a day shift staff of seven

persons, criminal investigators (three per shift) and three crime prevention, safety and village constables.

"Increases in future staffing numbers are dependent upon population growth in Milton," said Deputy Chief Algar in his memo.

## Gunplay trial postponed

A trial for a man charged with attempted murder in a Highway 401 shooting has been postponed until the new year.

Zdrovko Komsic, 48, of Kitchener was scheduled to stand trial Monday, but the case was adjourned until January 16 because not enough judges were available.

Judge Christopher Speyer told potential jurors, who were in the courtroom for another trial, that he was the only general division court judge assigned to criminal cases in Milton this week.

Eight cases, including Mr. Komsic's trial, were slated to begin Monday.

But, because one judge couldn't handle the caseload, the majority of the trials were re-scheduled and the

potential jurors were sent home and told to return Tuesday (yesterday).

Mr. Komsic was charged after a Waterloo couple's car was shot at during a traffic dispute with a pick-up truck driver on Hwy. 401 near Highway 25 shortly after midnight in November, 1993.

Court heard Mr. Komsic, who was scheduled to have a jury trial, has changed his mind and plans to stand trial by judge alone. If he pleads not guilty, the trial is expected to last four to five days.

He faces two counts each of attempted murder and pointing a firearm, as well as possession of a dangerous weapon, possession of an unregistered restricted firearm and dangerous driving.
