

Town acknowledges AIDS Day

The Town joined national and international health agencies December 1 in recognizing World AIDS day to acknowledge both individual suffering and social costs of AIDS, along with achievements in AIDS education, awareness and research programs.

Milton council will contribute \$250 to Milton resident Tina Braam, currently in New Zealand competing in the age 50 to 54 years of age World Triathlon. Ms Braam is a 10-year Milton resident, works at the Milton District Hospital and qualified for the World Championships in Australia in 1991, Canada in 1992, England in 1993 and New Zealand in 1994. Council similarly endorsed Milton resident Harry Barnes is also competing in New Zealand.

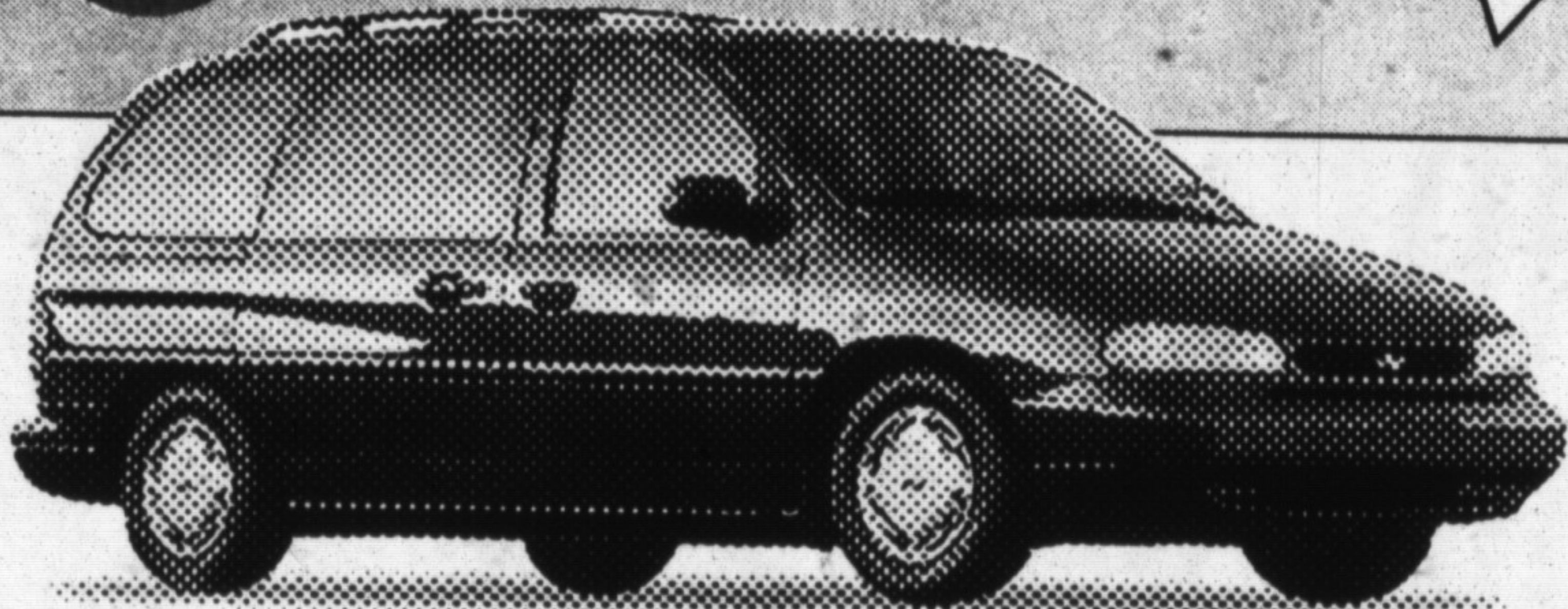
