

Two youths charged in fire at Baldwin school

Two youths have been charged for allegedly starting a fire in a garbage bin on Robert Baldwin School prop-

A resident who lives near the Wi-Ison Drive school called police at about 8 p.m. Dec. 1 reporting that he saw a pair of culprits lighting paper on fire and throwing it in a trash bin.

The Milton Fire Department extinguished the blaze. No damage was caused to the bin.

Police charged two 14-year-old male youths with mischief. The suspects are Milton residents, but don't live in the immediate area, nor do they attend the school, said Staff Sergeant Don Leroux of Halton Regional Police.

Their identities are protected under the Young Offenders Act.

It is alleged the investors were defrauded of more than \$500,000 between 1989 and 1992.


