Hunter wants information on relocating museum to John Martin House

The committee now has three task forces to look at issues of community suitability, heritage and environmental issues. It has also outlined a process for its work, will seek public consultation and hopes to hire a consultant. The study should take about six months.

"If the site is not deemed to be suitable, council will have to deal with the future use of the house and property," said leisure services director Jennifer Reynolds, warning "the house will require significant capital improvements over the next few years."

Councillor Hunter was complaining that the process wasn't going to see financial viability studied early enough. Ms Reynolds advised it would come later in the process.

"I see a focus on community, environment and heritage. I hear nothing about a full financial analysis of the site and whether this is viable financially," said Mr. Hunter.

Ms Reynolds said the long process would involve a marketing study.

Ward 2 regional Councillor Colin Best, also steering committee mem-

ber, said the committee already has information on the museum's operating costs and limited budget. He said the site would likely accommodate a one or two storey building and would offer less space than the current museum. However, Mr. Hunter wasn't altogether sold. "When it comes right down to it, is it going to be financially viable?" he asked, questioning the proposed site's size and potential parking requirements.

Mr. Hunter called for a break-even analysis upon which to base decision-making, and while Ms Reynolds assured the process would cover the issue, Mr. Hunter countered, "I'd like to see it brought on stream a little earlier."

"There is considerable interest in the outcome of this study," said Ms Reynolds. Some reported concerns include increased traffic, parking, the impact on Livingston Park, the size of any addition and building ownership.

Mr. Best said the steering committee is looking for a local council member and suggested Mr. Hunter may consider the job.
