PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO NINTH LINE FROM 1900 METRES SOUTH OF DERRY ROAD TO BRITANNIA ROAD

PROPOSED REPLACEMENT OF THE CULVERT ON NINTH LINE FOR THE EAST TRIBUTARY OF THE SIXTEEN MILE CREEK

The City of Mississauga is undertaking the planning and preliminary design for the proposed improvements to Ninth Line to the above limits in accordance with the requirements of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Road Projects under Schedule C. The purpose of the proposed improvements is to correct the structural adequacy of the existing road pavement and upgrade the existing roadway. A number of alternative solutions have been reviewed and evaluated from which a preferred alternative has been selected. The preferred alternative includes reconstructing this facility to a two lane semi-urban cross-section with intersection improvements. The proposal will provide the capability to expand to four through traffic lanes in the future.

Also proposed is the replacement of the culvert for the east tributary of the Sixteen Mile Creek. The culvert replacement is being planned under Schedule 'B' of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Water and Wastewater Projects.

Preliminary plans for the preferred alternative including the culvert replacement for Ninth Line have been prepared by the Transportation and Works Department. You are cordially invited to visit our drop-in-centre to view a static display and provide your comments. City of Mississauga staff members will be present to assist in your review and answer any questions you may have.


