

Most of Halton's political leaders were on hand yesterday morning to lend their voices to a discussion on the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) Task Force report.

The mayors of Burlington, Halton Hills and Milton along with Halton Regional Chair Joyce Savoline and Halton. North MPP Ted Chudleigh discussed municipal reform and field questions from the business community focusing on taxation, governance and local autonomy.

# Four cases of 'flesh-eating disease' reported in Halton

Halton had four cases of the "flesh-eating disease" including one death last month, according to the Halton Regional Health Department.

However, Mary Anne Carson, manager of communicable disease programs for the department, said the January numbers aren't alarming
