Denich scored a 5-0 decision in that match. He will remain in training for the National Juniors next month in Regina.

Chris Price, 141 lbs, made his final OFSAA championship a memorable one by reaching the final six for the second time in his career. It had been five years since his last trip to the finals, but it was no easy task as he found himself in one of OFSAA's toughest divisions.

After opening with 4-1 and 7-0 decisions, Price lost a 3-0 decision to the eventual silver medallist, Jamie Robitaille of Huronia. He rebounded with a 9-0 decision and then won a trip into the final six by scoring a come-from-behind over victory, 9-8, over Chinguacousy's Jeff Stewart.

A loss to bronze medallist Bob Richardson followed. Price then lost a two-point decision to Hagersville's Jeremy Little for fifth.

Price ends his high school career with a Drury record of 250 victories, a mark that may never be broken. Along with the victories, Price has over 40 medals, four Halton titles, two Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference titles, five provin-

cial medals — including two golds — plus a pair of national bronze medals to his credit.

He will join Sprenger at the National Espoirs later this month. Both wrestlers plan on continuing their careers at the university level and both are leaning towards joining the rebuilding program of the revitalized Guelph Gryphons.

Drury also enjoyed some other good results. John MacKinnon made it into the top 12 with three wins in the 127 lbs. class. MacKinnon's losses came to the gold and bronze medal winners.

Heavyweight Darrell Dennis placed in the top 16, winning two matches, including an upset opening round pin-over Bishop Ryan's Colin Shanahan, who later rebounded to take the bronze.

Frank Cavallo went winless but came very close to pulling off a major upset. Cavallo lost 2-1 in overtime to the number one seed and eventual silver medallist on a controversial referee's decision.

Many observers felt Cavallo earned the victory. Nevertheless, the experience should be a valuable one as he returns for one final season next year.

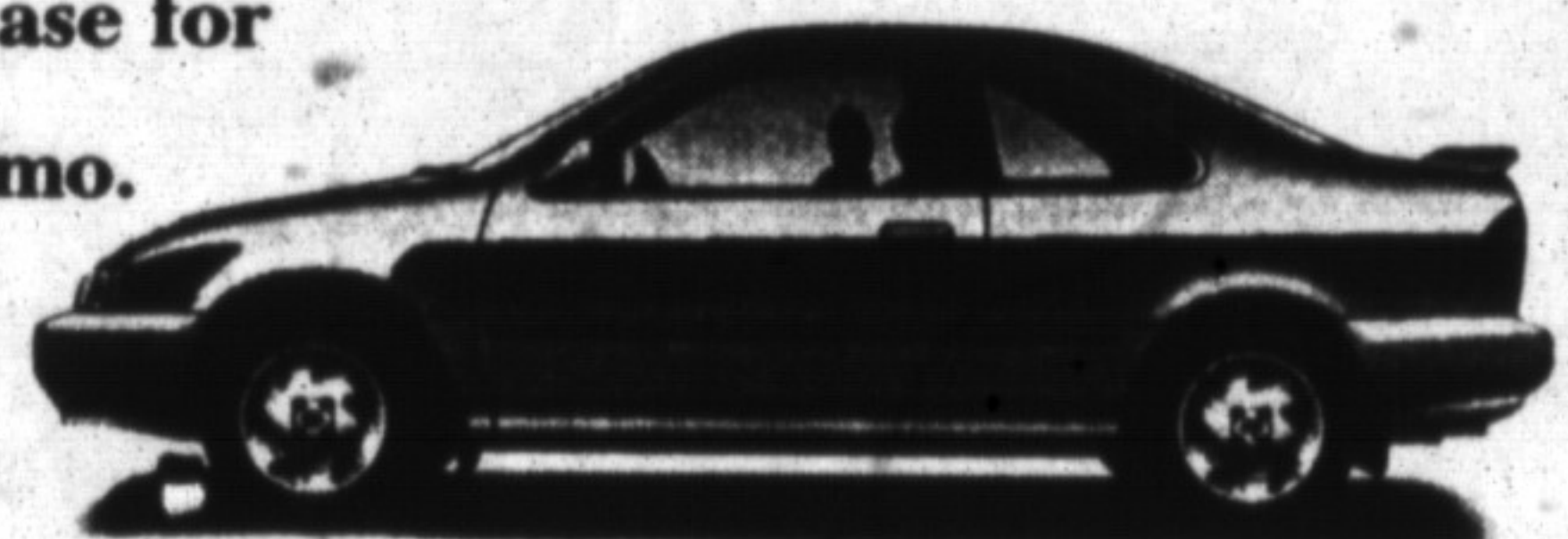
